# Important Note:

This amigurumi is worked with tightly fitted stitches in V shape and in a spiral. Do not close each round unless indicated; always mark the beginning of each round. Please read the entire pattern before starting. We have a tutorial on our channel for making this amigurumi. You can access the links attached to each image if you have any questions. If you find any errors in this pattern, please contact me.



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This amigurumi measures approximately 11 inches in height.

## Materials:

- 100% Mercerized Cotton Thread, with an average thickness of approximately 3mm. Available colors include Tangerine (orange), Coffee Mink (brown), White, and Leaf Green (green).
- 2.5mm crochet hook
- A 1mm thick white thread with a 1.0mm hook.
- A 1mm thick tan thread is used solely for embroidering the detail of the belt buckle and shoelace.
- Acrylic yarn (medium 4) by Crafter's Secret Big Idea in orange and tan colors.
- Grooming tool
- Wire for shaping the amigurumi.
- Glue
- 6mm safety eyelets
- Commute to work.
- Scissors
- Temporary marker
- Pins
- Amigurumi stuffing

Abbreviations:

- R: Round
- ch: chain
- AM: Magic ring
- pb: single crochet
- dec: decrease (sc 2tog)
- inc: increase (2 sc in 1 stitch)
- dc: double crochet
- hdc: half double crochet
- ss: slip stitch
- FLO: Front Loop Only
- BLO: Back Loop Only

### Important Note:

This pattern can be adjusted to create larger or smaller amigurumis using yarn of varying thicknesses. Choose your hook size accordingly based on the yarn thickness selected. Also, consider the size of safety eyes if you opt to use them. I hope you enjoy this pattern as much as I did designing it for you.



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# Legs (x2)

Placing wire on each leg of an amigurumi is used to provide support and stability. The wire is folded in half to form a "U" or hook, and then carefully inserted into the leg.

of the amigurumi. After inserting, place the padding only on the top of the leg, making sure the wire is at the base. This method helps maintain the desired shape and provides effective support for the amigurumi's legs.







R12-15: 6sc R16: FLO 6triple inc (18) R17: (1sc, 1inc) x9 (27) R18: 27sc R19: 27sc reversed https://youtu.be/G165FDaCoqY?t=596

Before continuing with joining the legs, it is essential to adjust the piece to simulate pants.



R20: 27sc R21: (1sc, 1dec) x9 (18) R22-23: 18sc R24: (1sc, 1dec) x6 (12) R25-26: 12sc R27: (1sc, 1dec) x4 (8) R28: 8sc



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When joining the legs, it is crucial to be meticulous, because each crochetter has their own style, even following the same pattern. In this round of binding, it is vital to identify the lateral that will go towards the center of each leg. Mark this point with a pin or temporary marker. If you need to adjust the start and end of this round, feel free to do so. This will ensure that your feet are not twisted later on.

Union R29: 2sc, 1ch, 8sc, 1sc in ch, 6<mark>sc (18)</mark>



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For greater comfort, you can join the wires together with thread, tape or another material you prefer, avoiding making it too thick since the waist will be very thin.

R30-31: 18sc R32: (4sc, 1dec) x3 (15) It is necessary to place stuffing in the area from the crotch to R32 to ensure that the amigurumi has the proper shape and stability. https://youtu.be/G165FDaCoqY?t=1286



R33: (3sc, 1dec) x3 (12) R34: 12sc R35: (2sc, 1dec) x3 (9) R36: (1sc, 1dec) x3 (6) R37-38: 6sc Change to white

R39: BLO 6ss R40: BLO 6sc R41: 6inc (12) Change to tangerine R42: BLO 12ss R43: BLO (1sc, 1inc) (18) R44-45: 18sc Change to white R46: BLO 18ss R47: BLO 18sc R48: 18sc R49: 9dec (9) Change to tangerine R50: BLO 9ss R51: BLO 9sc Change to white R52: BLO 9ss R53: BLO 9sc Change to tangerine R54: BLO 9ss R55: BLO 9sc

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In the chest area and up to the neck, it is necessary to place filling to give the amigurumi shape and stability. When you finish R55, cut the strand leaving a long section to join it later with the head. Also, cut the excess wire.

## Belt

Use Brown Mink yarn Start with 1 slip knot, 9ch, from the 2nd start BLO 8sc Cut the thread leaving it long for the connection to the waist.

With a millimeter thick tan thread and a wool needle, we will embroider the belt. We will use simple stitches until we form a square. For better understanding, please watch the video tutorial.



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With the same thread, embroider the shoelaces, forming a total of 6 crosses, with an intermediate round between each cross. https://youtu.be/G165FDaCogY?t=2338





## Boca

Begin using tangerine-colored yarn R1: 11ch, in 2nd begin (9sc, 1triple inc)x2 (24)

Note: The second triple increase will be done in the 11th chain from the beginning.

R2: (9sc, 3inc)x2 (30)

R3: 10sc, 4inc, 11sc, 4inc, 1sc (38) R4: 10sc, 2hdc, 1dc, 2dc inc, 1dc, 2hdc, 11sc, 2hdc, 1dc, 2dc inc, 1dc, 2hdc, 1sc (42 R5: 11sc, 1hdc, 1dc, 4dc inc, 1dc, 1hdc, 13sc, 1hdc, 1dc, 4dc inc, 1dc, 1hdc, 2sc (50) https://youtu.be/Rmh6ueHsASI?t=35



R6: 14sc, 6inc, 19sc, 6inc, 5sc (62) R7-17: 62sc Switch to mink brown color

R18-20: 62sc R21: 14sc, 6dec, 19sc, 6de<mark>c, 5sc (50)</mark>

Note: Before continuing to close, you need to add some padding so that when you close, it only remains at the bottom.

R22: 11sc, 1hdc, 1dc, 4dec dc, 1dc, 1hdc, 13sc, 1hdc, 1dc, 4dec dc, 1dc, 1hdc, 2sc (42) R23: 10sc, 2hdc, 1dc, 2dec dc, 1dc, 2hdc, 11sc, 2hdc, 1dc, 2dec dc, 1dc, 2hdc, 1sc (38) R24: 10sc, 4dec, 11sc, 4dec, 1sc (30) R25: (9sc, 3dec)x2 (24) R26: (9sc, 1triple dec)x2 (20)

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When finished, cut the yarn, leaving enough thread to close the piece using a wool needle. Close by stitching from one side to the other. Don't worry, this closure will be hidden. Then, turn the Brown Mink part inward.

## Teeth

Use 1mm thick white thread with a 1.0mm hook. Make a strip of 7 teeth and another strip of 6, or as many teeth as you like or even depending on the size of your amigurumi.

Start with 1 slip knot, 4ch, start in the 3rd ch 2dc, (5ch, start in the 3rd ch, 2dc)x5 or for as many times as you want.

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Place the teeth in the desired position, remembering that we want this mouth to appear to be biting the lower lip. Therefore, keep in mind that the lower center teeth will not be seen. You can glue them if you prefer, but I sewed them.

Ojos (x2)

Start using leaf green yarn R1: AM 8sc, close the ring with the 6mm safety eye inside and then close the piece using a wool needle.

R2: With white yarn, BLO 8ss https://youtu.be/Rmh6ueHsASI?t=2470



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R3: BLO 8inc (16) R4: (1sc, 1inc)x8 (24) R5-6: 24sc R7: (1sc, 1dec)x8 (18) R8: 8dec (8)

When finishing R8, leave a long thread to close using a wool needle. Before closing, place the necessary filling.

Eye coverage (x2) Use tangerine-colored yarn R1: MR 8sc R2: 8inc (16) R3: (1sc, 1inc)x8 (24) R4-6: 24sc When finished, close using a wool needle https://youtu.be/Rmh6ueHsASI?t=2700 Then sew an eye with an eye in the center. Position the tangerine-colored pieces and join them with seams or glue, however you feel most comfortable.

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Make the connection with the head making sure that they are slightly inclined upwards. You can make this union with glue for greater ease and precision.



# Cejas (x2)

Use mink brown yarn R1: MR 6sc R2-3: 6sc R4: (2sc, 1inc)x2 (8) R5: 8sc R6: (3sc, 1inc)x2 (10) R7-8: 10sc

When you finish R8, cut the yarn leaving it long to make the closure using a wool needle. These eyebrows do not need filling. https://youtu.be/q-fbe63zGQ8?t=170



For the hair, I cut orange and tan strands from 100% acrylic yarn. Please check the video we shared for better understanding. You must use a carding comb to achieve the desired effect with the wool. https://youtu.be/q-fbe63zGQ8?t=214

With the same yarn with which we wove the orange details, gradually join all the hair and twist it between the strands.

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## Hair base

Use tangerine-colored yarn R1: MR 6sc R2: 6inc (12) R3-5: 12sc https://youtu.be/q-fbe63zGQ8?t=915



When finishing this piece, cut the strand leaving it long to attach it to the base of the hair, making stitches with a wool needle. Then, join all the hair between the eyes, at the back and above the mouth, using glue for this union.

To join the eyebrows, use glue; stick the thinnest part near the eye and then stick the mlightly on the hair.

Attach the head to the body using the remaining strand that we left on the body. Make as many stitches as necessary to secure the head properly. I recommend watching the video for a detailed guide.

# Hands (x2)

Start with tangerine-colored yarn R1: MR 8sc R2-3: 8sc R4: (2sc, 1dec)x2 (6) R5-8: 6sc Switch to white R9: FLO 6triple inc (18) R10-11: 18sc R12: 18sc reverse R13: 18sc R14: (lsc, ldec)x6 (l2) Switch to tangerine R15: BLO 12ss R16: BI O 12sc R17: 12sc Switch to white R18: BI O 12ss R19: BLO 12sc R20: (2sc, 1dec)x3 (9) Switch to tangerine R21: BLO 9ss R22: BLO 9sc R23: 9sc Switch to white R24: BLO 9ss R25: BLO 9sc R26: (1sc, 1dec)x3 (6) R27: 6sc

When R27 is finished, place the wire. These arms do not need padding. Arrange the fabric in a similar way to what we did at the beginning with the legs.

# Fingers

Use the same tangerine colored thread. For both arms you will make the same pattern.

It will start on one side of the arm, whichever you prefer, between R3 and R4. Start on one side with 3ch and 2ss, 1ss more to start the next finger, then repeat 4 times: 4ch, 3ss, 1ss Secure and hide the strands





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To join both arms, it is necessary to watch the video that we share. You probably have leftover wire that you will need to cut. Always make sure to place your thumbs in the correct position, just like our hands. After this, you will be able to articulate your amigurumi.
