Important Note:

This amigurumi is worked with tightly fitted stitches in V shape and in a spiral. Do not close each round unless indicated; always mark the beginning of each round. Please read the entire pattern before starting.

We have a tutorial on our channel for making this amigurumi. You can access the links attached to each image if you have any questions.

If you find any errors in this pattern, please contact me.

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This amigurumi is approximately 11 inches tall, and you can articulate its entire body.





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Important Note:

This pattern can be adjusted to create larger or smaller amigurumis using yarn of varying thicknesses. Choose your hook size accordingly based on the yarn thickness selected. Also, consider the size of safety eyes if you opt to use them.

I hope you enjoy this pattern as much as I did designing it for you.

Materials:

- 100% Mercerized Cotton thread, average thickness approximately 3mm. Colors: white, black, turquoise, crystal green, flesh or skin color, gold, baby yellow, pink and orchid.
- 2.5mm hook
- Wire to articulate the amigurumi (Riley measures 28cm, depending on the thickness of your wire you will need to place it double or not)
- 10mm safety eyes
- Wool neddle
- Scissors
- Time marker
- Pins
- · Stuffing for amigurumis
- Blush for your cheeks is optional.

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Brazos (x2)


Starting with flesh-colored yarn

R1: AM 8sc

R2-4: 8sc Change to turquoise (in the

last sc of R4) R5: BLO 8sc

R9-22: 12sc 1ch to secure and cut the strand (no need to leave it long)

Fingers

Use flesh-colored thread.

Start by inserting the hook and pulling the loop out between R2 and 3 to one side.


3ch, BLO 2ss, skip a round, 1ss, (4ch, 3ss, skip 1 st (and taking all of R1, 1ss more)x4

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
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Place wire to articulate your arm, in the hand only the wire will remain and then in the rest of the arm, what you have woven with turquoise blue, fill it to your liking. (This wire measures approximately 30cm and folded in half it finally becomes a stronger wire with 15cm long.

Shoes and legs (x2)

Start using white yarn

R1: 6c, in the 2nd start (4sc, linc triple)x2 (14) R2: (4sc, 3inc)x2 (20) R3: 5sc, 4inc, 6sc, 4um, lp (28)

If even after watching the video shared above you still don't understand well or can't see why we used black thread for this amigurumi, here I share a tutorial dedicated exclusively to teaching you how to make decreases using only the back strands.

R8: 4sc, 4dec, 9sc (17)

R9: 17sc


R10: 4sc, 1dec, 6sc, 2dec, 1sc (14)

R11: 3sc, 2dec, 7sc (12) Cambiar a hilo color blanco

R12: BLO 12ss

Prepare wire to attach to the shoe and leave some left over for the rest of the body, keep in mind that this amigurumi measures approximately 28cm






R13: BLO 12sc R14-16: 12sc

Note: It is important that when making the first st of the next round, you use a temporary marker to mark the first back loop that you have left free, since this is where we will start the chain and the 1st sc of R18.


R17: FLO 12ss Cut the thread leaving enough to close using a wool needle but after finishing the next round https://youtu.be/38w2GKKQ-po?t=1021



Using black yarn R18: BLO 1ch, 12sc R19-33: 12sc

When you finish the first leg, make a chain to secure and cut the thread. It doesn't need to be long. However, when you finish the second leg, don't cut the thread as we will continue with the joining.

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Union

Before you begin this round, you need to determine which will be the center side of each leg. Mark it with a pin or temporary marker, and make sure that both legs are facing forward.

You may need to move your stitches around a bit in this round. If you need to, do so. I'll share with you exactly how my stitches turned out, but if you need to start with more or fewer sc, that's fine. The most important thing is to get to your marker.

Also, it is possible to achieve neat knitting even after stuffing the legs. If you notice that your stitches look slanted or that the knitting lines are not straight, adjust the knitting yourself and they will stay in place. I show this detail in the video, as it is very difficult to explain with pictures alone.

R34: 9sc, 2ch, 12sc on the other leg, 2sc one in each center chain, 3sc on the leg we started with (28)




R35-36: 28sc Change to crystal green in

the last sc of R36 R37: BLO 28sc R38: BLO 28sc

R39: 28sc Change to turquoise yarn in

the last sc of this R

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I used short wires, and so, using a strand, I attached another wire to the previous ones. If you are working with wires that come in rolls, ideal for amigurumis, you can skip this step.

R40: BLO 28ss

R41: BLO (3sc, linc)x14 (35)

R42-49: 35sc

Edge of the shirt

Use crystal green thread and work on the front strands that we left from R30.

Start as centered as possible on the back part.

1ch, on the same strand start 10sc, 3hdc, 10dc, 3hdc, 2sc.

Cut the strand leaving it long enough to close with a wool needle.

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
Sweater edge

Use turquoise thread and work on the front strands that we left from R38. Start as centered as possible on the back part.

R1: 1ch, on the same strand start 28sc (28) R2: 28sc (28) Cut the strand leaving it long enough to close with a wool needle.

Embroidered details of the shoes

Using black, turquoise and baby yellow thread, add details to the shoes.
Do a very basic embroidery on the bottom of the shoes.
Then, on the socks, simply place the threads

between rounds

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Continue joining the arms to the body

Before starting this round, it is necessary to determine each side of this body. Mark it with a pin or temporary marker. Also, mark on each arm where it will join the body, making sure that the thumb is always facing forward.

You may need to move your stitches around a bit in this round. If you need to, do so. I'll share with you exactly how my stitches turned out, but if you need to start with more or fewer single crochets, that's fine; your markers are your guide.

In the video I show this detail, since it is complicated to explain only with images.

R57: 7sc, 12sc on one arm, 15sc, 12sc on other arm, 8sc (54)



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R58: (7sc, 1dec)x6 (48)

R59-60: 48sc

Bend the wires from each arm to form the shoulders and join them to the wire coming from the legs to form the neck.

R61: (2sc, 1dec)x12 (36)

R62: (1sc, 1dec)x12 (24) Change to flesh-colored yarn in the last decrease of this round.

Also fill in as much as you like before continuing to close, although you can always add more later.

R63: BLO 24ss R64: BLO 24sc

R65: 12dec (12) R67-68: 12sc

R69: FLO (1sc, 1inc)x6 (18)

Note: I apologize. Due to a mistake in the wording of this pattern, we omitted Round 66. Just skip it and make only the rounds you see. It is a numbering error, and I do not correct the numbering of the following rounds to avoid confusion if you visit our videos.

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R70: (2sc, linc)x6 (24)

R71: 1sc, 1inc, (3sc, 1inc)x5, 2sc (30)

R72: (4sc, 1inc)x6 (36)

R73: 2sc, linc, (5sc, linc)x5, 3sc (42)

R74-75: 42sc

R76: (6sc, 1inc)x6 (48)

R77-88: 48sc

Remember that you can add the filler at any time you see fit. Depending on the thickness of the wire you are using, you may need to add filler around the wire in the neck area.

Before you begin decreasing, place the 10mm safety eyes as centered as possible on the front of the face, between Rounds 79 and 80, 10 stitches apart just before you place the eyes. The nose should go between Rounds 77 and 78; make 6 stitches over 2 1/2 stitches, using the same flesh-colored yarn. Make sure to center it as much as possible.

To insert the safety eye, it will be very helpful to create the hole first with some tool, such as your hook.

R89: (6sc, 1dec)x6 (42) R90: (5sc, 1dec)x6 (36) R91: (4sc, 1dec)x6 (30) R92: (3sc, 1dec)x6 (24) R93: (2sc, 1dec)x6 (18) R94: (1sc, 1dec)x6 (12)

R95: 12sc

When you're done, cut the thread, leaving it long enough to close the head using a tapestry needle. Remember to fasten off just before finishing. This head can take a lot of stuffing, so make sure the stitches don't come open. Also, secure the wire; I find that simply bending it will do the trick.

Triangle piece for the shirt

Start by using baby yellow thread (the same one I used in the detail of the legs), then we will also need pink, crystal green and orchid.

Every time you change colors, you can attach the new strand to the previous one; this is optional. In my case, I just hid the strands, and the result is excellent. Knots can add more volume to the piece, and in the end, everything will join together in the sweater.

R1: AM 1sc

R2: turn, linc (2)

R3: turn, 2inc (4) Change to Pink yarn

R4: turn, linc, 2sc, linc (6)

R5: turn, 6sc Change to Crystal Green yarn

(same as the shirt)

R6: turn, linc, 4sc, linc (8)

R7: turn, 8sc Change to Orchid yarn

R8: turn, 1ch, 1inc hdc, 6sc, 1inc hdc (10)

1 chain to secure and cut the thread leaving

enough thread just to hide it







Jacket cap

Use turquoise color yarn Start with 1 slip knot

R1: 12ch, in the 3rd start 9hdc, 1inc hdc, 9hdc (20) R2-5: 1ch, turn, BLO 20hdc, 40ch, 1ss (before making the ss that will join the chains to the other end you must make sure that they are all straight (60)

R6: BLO 60ss

Cut the thread leaving enough thread to close using a twool needle

Jacket pocket (x2)

Use turquoise color yarn

Start with 1 slip knot

R1: 7ch, in the 2nd start 6sc

R2-5: turn 6sc

R6: turn, 1dec, 4sc (5)

R7: turn, 3sc, 1dec (4)

R8: turn, 1dec, 2sc (3)

R9: turn, 1sc, 1dec (2)

1 chain to secure and cut the thread leaving

enough thread just to hide it





We will begin by joining all the pieces made previously: the colorful triangle, the hat and the pockets. Pay attention to the details:

- 1.Colorful Triangle: This triangle simulates the T-shirt underneath the sweater. The ends of the triangle are higher, so you can give it an arched shape.
- 2. Hat: Insert the head and determine the middle of the chains. Attach the center of the chains to the bottom of the sweater. Then, arrange it as shown in the pictures. At the back, form a curl and attach it there.
 - 3. Pockets: Leave pockets open.

You can join them with glue, although in my case I joined them with seams.

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Hair

Main piece that hugs the head

Use gold color yarn

Start with 1 slip knot

R1: 16ch, in the 3rd start BLO 14hdc (14)

R2-26: 1ch, turn BLO 14hdc (14)

Cut leaving the thread long enough to close this piece and

then join with the other end (to form the like a hat)

Locks (8 in total one after the other)

Use gold color yarn
Start with 1 slip knot
(38ch, in the 3rd start BLO 36hdc)x8
When finished leave the long thread to form the the hair and then join it to the previous piece.



Embrace all the strands with a wrapping movement and then secure it with stitches from side to side. (see video) https://youtu.be/YyNHeiufFog?t=460





Locks for the front (6 consecutive in total)

Use gold thread
Start with 1 slip knot
(14ch, in the 3rd start BLO 12hdc)x6
When finished you do not need to leave the strand long since the join will be made with a thinner strand of the same thread.



Stitch the eyebrows just before attaching the hair to the head, using gold thread, the same color as the hair. These are very simple stitches; just pay attention to where you place the pins. (see video)

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Ears (x2)

Use flesh-colored yarn.

Start by leaving the thread long at the beginning, it will help us with the union to the head
