If selling your completed item online, kindly include a link to our website in your description to support our project. This amigurumi is crocheted using tight V-shaped and spiral stitches. Avoid closing each round unless specified, and
remember to mark the start of every round diligently. It is advisable to review the complete pattern before starting.
Prior to purchasing this pattern, we inform you that a tutorial is available on our channel for creating this amigurumi.

Kuromi is approximately 18cm tall.

Materials:

- 100% cotton yarn (La Abuelita brand).
 Colors: 50g White, black and Pink.
- 2.5mm hook
- Wool Needle
- Scissors
- A strand of finer black and pink yarn for the embroidery of the face
- Temporary marker
- Pins
- Hot silicone glue (optional).
- Stuffing for amigurumis

Abbreviations:

R: Round ch: chain AM: Magic Ring pb: single crochet dis: decrease (close 2pb together) inc: Increase (2sc in 1stc) dc: double crochet hdc: half double crochet ss: slip stitch FLO: Front Loop Only BLO: Back Loop Only

You can apply this same method to adjust the size of this amigurumi by using a thicker or thinner yarn. The hook number required will vary based on the yarn chosen.

I trust you will appreciate this design as much as I enjoyed creating it for you.





Legs (x2)

Use white yarn.

R1: MR 8 sc.

R2: 8 inc (16).

R3-5: 16 sc.

Optional: Apply hot silicone glue or use a button/plastic to make it flat.

After finishing the first leg, make 1 ch to secure and cut the yarn. After finishing the second leg, do not cut the yarn.






Union

R6: 4 sc, 1 ch, 16 sc on the other leg, 1 sc in the ch, 12 sc on the first leg (34).

R18: (1 sc, 1 inc) x12 (36).
R19: (2 sc, 1 inc) x12 (48).
R20: 1 sc, 1 inc, (3 sc, 1 inc) x11, 2 sc (60).
R21-33: 60 sc.
R34: (3 sc, 1 dec) x12 (48).
R35: 48 sc.
R36: (2 sc, 1 dec) x12 (36).
R37: 36 sc.
R38: (1 sc, 1 dec) x12 (24).
R39: 12 dec (12).
R40: 12 sc.
Stuff and close using the yarn needle.

Arms (x2) Use white yarn. R1: MR 6 sc. R2: (1 sc, 1 inc) x3 (9). R3: 4 sc, 1 bobble stitch: 4 hdc closed together in the same stitch, 4 sc (9).


R4-8: 9 sc. Stuff only at the beginning. R9: close with 4 sc. Make 1 ch to secure and cut the yarn, leaving a long tail to attach to the body. https://youtu.be/dnlbegjOhYc?t=401

Use thin pink thread to embroider the nose. Embroider it between R23 and 24, just above two stitches that are as centered as possible on the front of the face. You can make about 6 stitches or as many as you want, depending on how many stitches you make, the volume of the nose will be defined. (See video if necessary)


To embroider the eyes use super fine black thread.

Place the eyes approximately 4 stitches from the nose, between R24 and 25. At this point, place the first pin. Then, between R26 and 27, place two more pins, forming a triangle. Stitch as many times as pecessary until all

Stitch as many times as necessary until all the white fabric is covered.


To finish, seal the top with a horizontal stitch and then add the two eyelashes. (Refer to the video if necessary.)

Use black yarn R1: MR 6sc R2: 6inc (12) R3: (1sc, 1 inc) x6 (18) R4: (2sc, 1 inc) x6 (24) R5: 1sc, 1inc, (3sc, 1inc)x5, 2sc (30) R6: (4sc, 1inc) x6 (36) R7: 2sc, 1inc, (5sc, 1inc)x5, 3sc (42) R8: (6sc, 1inc) x6 (36) R9: 3sc, 1inc, (7sc, 1inc) x5, 4sc (54) R10: (8sc, 1inc) x6 (60) R11-26: 60sc R27: 1dc, (inc: 1dc, 1double dc), 1dc, 1hdc, 1sc, 1ss. Close with a twool needle

Putting on the cap:

Place the hat on Kuromi's head, making sure the tip is as centered on her face as possible and the back of the hat is snug against her neck. To secure it, you can use glue to secure the seam, or sew it on if you prefer a firmer hold.

Ears (x2)

For each ear, make two separate pieces that you will then sew together. Make sure to line them up well before sewing so that they fit together perfectly.

Using black yarn R1: AM 6sc R2: (2sc, 1inc)x2 (8) R3: (3sc, 1inc)x2 (10) R4: (4sc, 1inc)x2 (12) R5: (2sc, 1inc)x4 (16) R6: (3sc, 1inc)x4 (20) R7: 20sc R8: (4sc, 1inc)x4 (24) R9: (5sc, 1inc)x4 (24) R9: (5sc, 1inc)x4 (28) R10-11: 28sc R12: (10sc, 1quadruple dec)x2 (22) R13: (9sc, 1dec)x2 (20) When finished leave the long strand to later make the join to the head

Close with a tapestry needle Use a wool needle to close this piece, forming a ball at the end. Once the ball is well formed, join it to the tip of the previous piece. (See the video for a better understanding).

Before you place the ears on your head, make sure to add a little bit of stuffing to each one. Don't use too much; the stuffing should be enough so that when you press them, they hold the desired shape without adding too much weight to the head. Place the ears in the position you prefer. Make a total of 8 pink circles. Then, crochet the next piece using black yarn, joining the circles together each time you complete a repeat. Although the process seems simple, if you notice that the circles are not in the correct position, please refer to the shared video for a more detailed guide.

With black color yarn start with 1 lipknot (3ch, 1ss in the circle, 1sc, 1hd, 1dc)x8











Tail

Using black color yarn R1: AM 2sc R2: turn, 2inc (4) R3: turn, 1inc, 2sc, 1inc (6) R4: turn, 6sc R5: turn, 2k, 2sc R6-14: turn, 2sc, 1ch to secure.

When you finish weaving the tail, leave a long strand so you can attach it to the body at the back.

Using pink color yarn aand starting with a slip knot

R1: (2sc, 1triple inc)x2 (10)

R2: (2sc, 3inc)x2 (16)

R3: 1ss, 1ch, 1sc at the same base of the slip knot, 2sc, 1ch, 1ss at the base of the last sc

To embroider the details of the skull, please refer to the video we shared. Although the process is very simple, it is important that you observe how to do it to get the best result. Also, make sure to glue the skull as centered as possible on the front of the hat.
