# **Important Note:**

This amigurumi is worked with tight V-shaped and spiral stitches. Do not close off each row unless indicated: make sure to always mark the beginning of each row. Please read the entire pattern before starting. We have a tutorial on our channel to make this amigurumi. You can access the links attached to each image if you have any questions. If you find any errors in this pattern, please contact me.





This amigurumi is approximately 24cm tall, and you can articulate its entire body. In the image you see, she is attached to a base, this amigurumi does not stand alone.



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### **Important Note:**

This pattern can be adapted to create amigurumi of different sizes using yarn of different thicknesses. Adjust the hook size according to the thickness of the yarn selected. Also consider the size of the safety eyes if you decide to use them.

I hope you enjoy designing this pattern for yourself as much as I did.

#### **Materials:**

- 100% Mercerized Cotton thread, average thickness approximately 3mm. Colors: straw, turquoise, citrus and orchid
- 2.5mm hook
- Wire to articulate the amigurumi (Alegría measures approximately 24cm, depending on the thickness of your wire you will need to place it double or not)
- 10mm safety eyes
- Wool needle
- Scissors
- Time marker
- Pins
- Stuffing for amigurumis
- Blush for your cheeks is optional.
- Glue (only if you want to glue hair)

#### **Abbreviations:**

R: Round

• ch: chain

• AM: Magic ring

• pb: single crochet

• dec: decrease (sc 2tog)

• inc: increase (2 sc in 1 stitch)

• dc: double crochet

• hdc: half double crochet

• ss: slip stitch

• FLO: Front Loop Only

• BLO: Back Loop Only



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## Brazos (x2)

Use straw-colored yarn

R1: MR 6sc R2-4: 6sc

R5: (1sc, 1dec) x2 (4)

R6: 4sc

R7: (1sc, 1inc) x2 (6)

R8-10: 6sc

R11: (2sc, 1inc) x2 (8)

R12-18: 8sc"

Cut the thread leaving a long section to make a perfect closure with the help of a wool needle. This will make it easier to join it to the body later.

The perfect cast off is done with a tapestry needle. After cutting and pulling out the yarn, skip a stitch and pass the needle under the next chain. Then, insert the needle again into the last single crochet you made. For greater clarity, I invite you to watch the video just once and you will understand it easily. Every time you make a perfect cast off, you will follow this same process.

Next, we will make the fingers.

For both arms, you'll be using the exact same pattern. When you position them along the body, they might look slightly different, but it will be barely noticeable. To begin, determine which side you'll start on between rows R2 and R3. Lay the arm flat to make the process easier. At the point where you can insert the hook, start by pulling out a loop. Leave a little bit of a tail at the beginning, this will make it easier to secure and hide later. As you make the first finger, simply hold the tail as best you can.

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## Fingers

3ch, BLO 2ss, 1pd between R1 and 2, (4ch, BLO 3ss, 1ss more in the next stitch embracing the entire R1 )x4

When you finish the second finger, make the slip stitch at the same base where you made the slip stitch of the first finger. Similarly, the slip stitch of the fourth finger should be made at the base of the third finger. This is necessary due to the limited number of stitches. 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# Piernas (x2)

Use Straw colored yarn
Start with a slip knot
R1: 4ch, in the 2nd begin
(2sc, linc)x2 (8)

R2-4: 8sc

R5: 1sc, 2hdc, 1sc, 4hdc (8)

R6: 1sc, 2hdc, 2sc, 1hdc dec, 1sc (7)

R7: 1sc, 2hdc, 4sc (7)

R8: 1sc, 2hdc, 2sc, 1dec (6)

R9-10: 6sc

R11: (2sc, 1inc) x2 (8)

R12-13: 8sc

R14: (3sc, linc) x2 (10)

R15: 10sc

R16: (4sc, linc) x2 (12)

R17: 12sc

R18: (5sc, 1inc) x2 (14)


R19-20: 14sc

R21: 5sc, 2dec, 5sc (12)

R22-30: 12sc

When you finish the first leg, cut the thread leaving enough length to make a perfect closure. However, when you finish the second leg, do not cut the thread, as you will continue joining both legs. Before doing so, place wire to articulate the amigurumi, making sure that there is enough wire for the head, considering the total height of the amigurumi. Also, stuff the leg. Do not put stuffing in the foot, but in the rest of the leg, always keeping the wire as centered as possible.

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We start by joining the legs in round 31. In this round, I'll share with you exactly the stitches I got at the beginning and the end, but in the video I explain that they might be different for you. The most important thing is to make sure that both feet are facing the same direction. To do this, flatten each leg and, as you can see in the images, place markers on each side of the center.

## Union of the legs

R31: 5sc continuing on the 2nd leg that I made (the one I didn't close), 2ch, 12sc on the other leg (starting at the marker), 2sc in the 2ch, 7sc more on the leg that started this round (28)

R32-36: 28sc

R37: (5sc, 1dec) x4 (24)

R38: 24sc

R39: (4sc, 1dec) x4 (20)

R40-45: 20sc

We will join the arms using the same technique we used to join the legs earlier. This time, flatten the body and place a marker on each side. The arms should also be flattened to determine where to start on each one. The most important thing is to make sure that the smallest of the five toes is facing the same direction as the feet, that is, facing forward.

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## Union with arms

R46: lsc, 8sc on one arm, 9sc, 8sc on other arm, 8sc (36)


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Before continuing, it's time to prepare the wire to connect the arms, leaving some excess to attach to the wire of the legs.

These arms don't need stuffing, but if you want to add it, you can do so.

R47: 36sc

R48: (4sc, 1dec) x6 (30)

R49: 30sc

R50: (3sc, 1dec) x6 (24)

R51: 12dec (12) R52-54: 12sc

R55: FLO (1sc, 1inc) x6 (18)

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R56: (2sc, 1inc) x6 (24)

R57: 1sc, 1inc, (3sc, 1inc) x5, 2sc (30)

R58: (4sc, 1inc) x6 (36)

R59: 2sc, linc, (5sc, linc) x5, 3sc (42)

R60-61: 42sc

R62: (6sc, 1inc) x6 (48)

R63-74: 48sc

Before continuing with all the rounds of only 48 sc, you can add more stuffing to the body if needed. It is very important to put stuffing around the wire in the neck for more stability.

Then we will continue with the embroidery of the nose and eyes.
-Embroider **the nose between rounds 63 and 64**, covering approximately 3 stitches.

-Place the 10mm safety eyes between rounds 65 and 66, leaving approximately 10 stitches of space between them.

R75: (6sc, 1dec) x6 (42) R76: (5sc, 1dec) x6 (36) R77: (4sc, 1dec) x6 (30) R78: (3sc, 1dec) x6 (24) R79: (2sc, 1dec) x6 (18)

R80: (1sc, 1dec) x6 (12)

R81: 12sc

The head stuffing can be added when you feel it is appropriate. After completing round 81, cut the yarn leaving enough length to fasten off with a tapestry needle.



Embroider the eyebrows using only 2 strands of the same yarn, in turquoise, which will be the same color you will use later for the hair. Please see the video for a better understanding of the process.



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### Dress

Use citrus green thread Start with a 1 slipknot R1: 20c, in the 6th start 15 inc dc (30)

R2: 1ch, rotate, (1dc, 1dc inc) x2, skip 7 stitches, (1dc, 1dc inc) x4, skip 7 stitches, (1dc, 1dc inc) x2 (24)

R3-4: 1ch, turn, 24dc (24) R5: 1ch, turn, (1dc, 1dc inc) x12, 1ss (36) R6-10: 1ch, 36dc, 1ss (36)

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Make a perfect closure with the wool needle at the end of round 10.

Place a button to close the dress, the color is your choice. The measurement can be any, as long as the button goes through the buttonhole we left in round 1.

Create the details using only two strands of the same yarn, but in orchid color. There is no exact pattern for each detail, but I will show you the result with pictures so you can follow along.





### Hair

Use turquoise-colored yarn

R1: MR 6sc R2: 6inc (12)

R3: (1sc, 1inc) x6 (18) R4: (2sc, 1inc) x6 (24)

R5: 1ss, (17ch, in the 2nd ch from hook start 1ss, 1sc, 14hdc, 1ss x24





Smaller strands (x3)

(7ch, in the 2nd row start BLO 1ss, 1 sc, 4 hdc)x3 Make 1 chain to secure and cut the strand, leaving it long to position these three small strands on the hair.

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We'll be adding Joy's hair, and this is the most important thing to keep in mind when attaching it:

- 1. Use pins to position all the strands before securing them permanently.
- 2. The three strands should be on top, but it is not necessary to center them on the head.
- 3. The back strands should almost touch your neck, so that the front strands do not cover your eyes. Do not pull them too tight.
- 4. There are many images that can guide you in how to place your hair, but in the video I show you one by one where to place each strand.
- 5.1 will use glue to secure the hair, but if you prefer, you can sew it in.

Ball

Using Orchid color yarn

R1: MR 6sc R2: 6inc (12)

R3: (1sc, 1inc)x6 (18)

R4-6: 18sc

When finishing round 6, turn the fabric only if you prefer to keep the same texture. It is something you can consider according to your preference.

R7: (1sc, 1dec) x6 (12)
