Important Note:

This amigurumi is worked with tight V-shaped and spiral stitches. Do not close off each row unless indicated; make sure to always mark the beginning of each row. Please read the entire pattern before starting. We have a tutorial on our channel to make this amigurumi. You can access the links attached to each image if you have any questions. If you find any errors in this pattern, please contact me.





With this pattern you can create all the essential nativity characters you see in the image. The set includes Mary, Joseph, Baby Jesus, the three Wise Men, the angel and the star of Bethlehem. Each one has been designed with a level of detail that will make your nativity scene stand out for its beauty and delicacy.

Here are the approximate measurements for each member, but it is important to remember that these dimensions can vary depending on the material you choose to use, as well as the thickness of the needle and the tension with which you knit:

- Mary, Joseph, King, Melchior, King Gaspar, King Balthazar: 15cm
- Baby Jesus in his basket: 7cm
- Angel: 11cm
- Star of Bethlehem: 7cm

Each character has its own charm and style, and with the right colors and details, you can personalize your nativity scene however you like!

We provide you with the full range of colours we have used for each member of the birth, which will allow you to achieve a similar look. However, we invite you to customize the colours according to your style and preferences.

Colors used for Maria:

- Old rose for the body
- Meat or skin for hands and head
- Strong cinnamon for hair
- Orchid blue for the coat
- Mango yellow for the halo
- Tobacco for the waist cord

Colors used for Jose:

- Burdeos red for the body
- Meat or skin for hands and head
- Strong cinnamon for hair
- Fresh green for the coat
- Gold for the tunic
- Tobacco for the cord on the waist and the cane





Colors used for baby Jesus:

- Cinnamon for the basket
- Straw for the blanket
- White and flesh or skin for baby Jesus
- Mango yellow for the halo

Colors used for Gaspar:

- · Leaf green for the body
- Meat or skin for hands and head
- Hair brick
- Gold for the crown and the cape
- Intense olive for the cape

Colors used for the angel:

- White for the body
- · Meat or skin for hands and head
- Gold for hair
- Mango yellow for the halo

Colors used for Melchor:

- · Nordic blue for the body
- Meat or skin for hands and head
- White for hair
- Gold for the crown and the cape
- Burdeos red for the crown and cape

Colors used for Baltazar:

- Burdeos red for the body
- Wheat for hands and head
- Black for hair
- Rosewood for the turban and cape
- Gold for the details on the turban and cape

Colors used for the Star of Bethlehem and gifts:

- Mango yellow for the star
- Rosewood, garnet red, strong cinnamon and gold for gifts





Yarn used:

• For this project I used Sinfonía yarn, made of 100% mercerized cotton. This yarn has an approximate thickness of 3 mm and is made up of 6 strands, which gives it a soft and high-quality finish.

Materials:

- 2.5mm hook
- Black sewing thread for embroidering the eyes
- Silicone glue stick
- Wire to articulate the amigurumi
- Wool needle
- Scissors
- Time marker
- Pins
- Stuffing for amigurumis
- Blush for your cheeks is optional.

Baby Jesus

Start using white yarn

R1: AM 6sc

R2: 6inc (12)

R3-6: 12sc Change to flesh-colored yarn

Use:

We will always do the color change using this technique, as it is easier for us and ensures a clean finish. However, you can do the color change using any method you prefer, adapting the pattern to your personal style.

When you finish R14, cut the thread leaving enough length to close using a tapestry needle. Before doing so, it is important to stuff the piece very well to ensure the proper shape.

To embroider the eyes, first place pins between R9 and R10, leaving about 6 stitches between them. Try to center the pins as much as possible.

Using black sewing thread, using double strand and a tapestry needle, we will embroider the eyes just above the R9. This embroidery is very basic, but if you consider it necessary, you can check out the video where we explain the process in detail.

Using white color yarn

R1: MR 6 sc R2: 6inc (12)

R3: (1 sc, 1 inc) x6 (18) R4: (2 sc, 1 inc) x6 (24)

R5-9: 24 sc

When you finish R9, cut the thread leaving enough length to make a perfect closure. With this closure we achieve that the join of the piece is less visible. Every time we mention making a "perfect closure with a tapestry needle", we will be referring to this technique. For a better understanding, please consult the link to the video where we explain the process in detail.

Next, attach the hat to the head. At the back, secure it very well to the knitted piece using white thread. It is not really a hat, but rather a "cocoon." Sew with only two strands of the same thread to join the hat together, or use glue if you prefer.

Halo of the baby Jesus

R1: MR 8sc R2: 8inc (16)

R3: (1sc, 1inc)x8 (24)

When you finish R3, make a perfect closure using a wool needle, ensuring a neat finish on the piece.

Join the halo to the head, making sure that you can see it from the front, but not too much. Use glue to join the halo only to the lower part of the head.

Using cinnamon-colored yarn:


R1: 6ch, starting in the 2nd ch

(4sc, 1 triple inc) x2 (14)

R2: (4 sc, 3 inc) x2 (20)

R3: 5 sc, 4 inc, 6 sc, 4 inc, 1 sc (28)

R4: 6 sc, 6 inc, 8 sc, 6 inc, 2 sc (40)



R7: 1 ch, (2 dc front post, 2 dc back post) x10, 1 ss (40)

R8:1 ch, 40 dc, 1 ss (40)


R9: 1 ch, (2 dc back post, 2 dc back post) x10, 1 ss (40)

R10: 1 ch, 40 sc, 1 ss (40)

The "back post" is the same as what we call "relief stitch", where we take the stitch from the previous round from behind. If you are not familiar with this technique, please check the video, as we will use it several times throughout the pattern.



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When you finish the last slipped stitch of R10, make a perfect cast off using a tapestry needle to ensure a neat and clean finish on the piece.

R4: (2 sc, 1 inc) x8 (32)

R5: 1 sc, 1 inc, (3 sc, 1 inc) x7, 2 sc (40)

R6: (4 sc, 1 inc) x8 (48) R7: 1 ss, (2 ch, 1 ss) x48

When you're done, cut the thread.

There's no need to leave it long; just pull it back to the back, secure it, and hide it. Then, arrange the piece in the basket as you like.

We will make 5 base bodies using the same pattern, but with different colors for each one. Below, we will share with you which member each body is for and the specific colors we will use for each one.

Base bodies for the characters:

- · Maria: Old rose and flesh or skin
- José: Garnet red and flesh or skin
- Melchor: Nordic blue and flesh or skin
- Gaspar: Leaf green and flesh or skin
- Baltazar: Burdeos red and wheat-colored thread

The demonstration will be done using Baltazar colors only.





Brazos (x2)

Start using the appropriate color for the skin

R1: MR 8sc

R2-5: 8sc In the last sc of R5 Change to the appropriate color yarn for each body



Make a perfect seam at the end of each arm. This will make it easier to join the body later and ensure a clean, neat finish.



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Body

Begin the body using the appropriate yarn color for each body

R1: MR 8sc

R2: 8inc (16)

R3: (1sc, 1inc)x8 (24) R4: (2sc, 1inc)x8 (32)

R5: 1sc, 1inc, (3sc, 1inc)x7, 2sc (40)

R6: 40sc back post

R7-8: 40 sc

After finishing R8, place the base on a flat surface and apply hot silicone glue. Make sure to heat up your glue gun very well, as the heat will allow the base to set on its own. When the silicone cools, the base will become firm, allowing your amigurumi to stand very well on its own.

If you prefer, you can also place a button that is the same size as the base, or cut a piece of plastic that works well as reinforcement. I do not recommend using cardboard, as it could deform over time and affect the stability of your amigurumi.


After R27, put stuffing on the body before continuing to close. Be careful not to put too much stuffing so that the base remains flat and the amigurumi is stable. https://youtu.be/xMIAhbnHC4E?t=1614



R28: 12dec (12) Change to the same color of yarn that I used on the hands
R29-30: 12sc

After finishing R30, wire each arm. This is optional; you can leave the arms unwired if you prefer. However, by wire-wiring, the excess will be left on the head, which will allow Mary to be positioned very tenderly, especially by having her look towards baby Jesus.

R31: FLO 12inc (24) R32: (1sc, 1inc)x12 (36)

After R32, I suggest you add a little more stuffing to the body, especially around the wire in the neck area, to ensure a firm and stable shape.

Stuff the head after finishing R45, always trying to keep the wire as centered as possible. Keep in mind that when you finish the last round of the head, you can add more stuffing if you consider it necessary to give it the right shape.

R46: (2sc, 1dec)x6 (18) R47: (1sc, 1dec)x6 (12)

R48: 12sc

When you finish R12, cut the thread leaving enough length to completely close the head using a wool needle.

You have now completed a body.
Remember to repeat this process a total of 5 times, using the correct colors for each character or the ones you have chosen.
Next, we will begin with the specific details of each of them.





Let's start by embroidering the eyes of Mary and Joseph, since the design of the eyes is the same for both. Place pins between R36 and R37, leaving approximately 8 stitches between them. Then, higher up, between R37 and R38, place two pins for each eye, forming a triangle.

Use black thread and double strand to embroider the eyes, using the pins as a guide to obtain a symmetrical and neat position. You can check out the video for more details on the process.



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Mary and Joseph's cloak follows the same pattern, but using different colors of thread. For Mary, use orchid color, and for Joseph, fresh green.

Use appropriate color of thread for each one Start with 1 slip knot

R1: 71ch, in the 2nd row start BLO 70hdc (70)

R2-7: 1ch, turn BLO 70hdc (70)

R8: 1ch, turn BLO 31 hdc, 4dec hdc, 31hdc (66)

R9: 1ch, turn BLO 29 hdc, 4dec hdc, 29hdc (62)

R10: Join, 31ss joining one side to the other, 1ch to secure.

When you're done joining, turn the piece over to make sure everything is properly assembled and in place.

R3: (1sc, 1inc)x8 (24)

R4: 1ss, (25ch, in the 2nd begin BLO 24 hdc,

When you finish the last stitch of hair, pull the strand back, secure it and hide it for a clean, neat finish.

R5: 1sc, 1inc, (3sc, 1inc)x7, 2sc (40)



Joseph Tunic

Use gold thread Start with 1 slip knot

R1: 37ch, in the 2nd start BLO 36hdc (36)

R2: 1ch, turn BLO 36hdc (36)

R3-4: 1ch, turn, BLO 16hdc (16)

R5: 1ch, turn, BLO 16hdc, 21ch

R6: in the 2nd ch start BLO 36hdc

R7: 1ch, turn, BLO 36hdc(36)

When finished, make a chain to secure, break the thread and hide it carefully for a neat finish.

Using tobacco-colored thread, make two cords for the waist, one for Mary and one for Joseph.

- For Maria: Start with a slip knot and weave 50 chains.
- For Joseph: Start with a slip knot and weave 60 chains.

Walking Stick for José Use tobacco colored yarn

R1: MR 6sc

R2-33: 6sc

Once you have finished all the rounds. prepare the wire and place it inside the piece. Then, close the fabric using a wool needle and adjust the desired shape to give it the final finish.







To join all the pieces, we will use hot silicone glue. However, if you prefer, you can also sew the pieces together. Please note that I have not fixed the cloak with glue, so you can adjust it according to your preference. The waist cord is only tied, without needing to be fixed. I encourage you to watch the video through the shared link, in case the images are not enough to guide you through the process.

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Let's start with the embroidery of the eyes for the Three Wise Men, since the design is the same for all three. Place pins between R38 and R39, leaving approximately 4 stitches between the eyes. Each eye will take up 3 stitches, and the embroidery will be done just above R38.



For Balthazar's hair and beard, use black thread. Follow exactly the same instructions as for Joseph, for both the hair and the beard. The only difference is that, for Balthazar, you will not flip the hair.

Melchior and Gaspar's hair are exactly the same pattern. However, for Melchior you will use white thread, and for Gaspar you will use brick-colored thread.

R4: (2sc, 1inc)x6 (24)

R7-13: 36sc

R14: 1ss, (8ch, in the 2nd st start BLO 7hdc,

skip 2st, 1ss)x12





When you finish the last slip stitch of this hair, secure it and hide it. Keep in mind that, for Jose, we are going to flip this hair to achieve the proper finish.

The same goes for Melchior and Gaspar's beards, which follow exactly the same pattern. As with the hair, for Melchior you will use white thread, and for Gaspar, brick-colored thread.

Start with a slip knot 20ch, in the 2nd start, 2sc, 2hdc, 2dc, 1dc double, 1inc dc double, 1dc double, 1inc triple dc double, 1dc double, 1inc dc double, 1dc double, 2dc, 2hdc, 2sc, 7pd, 5c, skip 5sts 7pd, 1chain to secure









The capes of the Three Wise Men follow exactly the same pattern. However, the colors vary for each one:

• Melchor: Burgundy red and gold

• Gaspar: Rosewood and gold

Baltazar: Intense olive and gold

R3: 1ch, turn, BLO 14hdc, 4sc(18)

R4: 1ch, turn, BLO 4sc, 14hdc (18)

In the last hdc of R16 change to gold thread, slip stitch around the edge until you reach the top corner, 13ch in the 2nd st, start BLO 12ss, more ss on the edge, in the other corner again 13ch in the 2nd st, start BLO 12ss, complete the remaining edge with ss.

It is important to fill the piece as you go, since leaving all the filling for the end can be more complicated. When you have finished all the rounds, join the piece with a seam using a tapestry needle to ensure a good finish.

With Gold thread

R1: 5ch, in the 2nd start 4sc

R2-12: turn, 4sc

Finish the piece by making a chain to secure, cut and hide the strands, then join it to the ring formed previously in the closure area, using glue to secure the joint.

We will begin by joining each piece together to form each Wise Man. We will use silicone glue to join all the parts together, but if you prefer, you can sew the pieces together. Don't forget to check out our video if you have any questions during the process. Also, it is necessary to stretch the fabric of each hair to obtain the desired finish before joining it together. Please note that I have not attached the crowns to the heads and the capes will only be secured with a simple knot in the front.







Let's make the gifts: two boxes and a vase. You can choose the colours you prefer, but I made a box in burgundy red and gold, another in rosewood and gold, and the vase in strong cinnamon and gold.

For each box, you will make two different but very similar pieces. Then, you will mount one piece on top of the other. With a strand of gold thread, you will add the decorative detail. It is important that you watch the video for a better understanding of the process.

R19: 3sc 4sc in one arm, 6sc, 4sc in other

R21: 9dec (9) Change to flesh-colored yarn

in the last decrease

Stuff the piece and attach the arm wires at a time that is most comfortable for you. This will allow you to work more flexibly according to your preference.




Use white thread Start with 1 slipknot

R2: 4ch, turn, in the 3rd start BLO 6hdc, 2inc hdc, 4hdc (14)

R3: 1ch, turn, BLO 4hdc, 4inc hdc, 6hdc (18)

R4: 4ch, turn, in the 3rd start BLO 10hdc, 4inc hdc, 6hdc (24)

Use Mango Yellow yarn Make two exactly the same pieces. Close one of them, but leave the other open to continue joining (see video for more details) Rounds:

R1: MR 6sc R2: 6inc (12)

R3: Begin this round with 1 sl st, then proceed with each point; there are 8 points in total.

Point 1: 7 ch, starting in the 2nd ch from the hook: BLO 1ss, 1 sc, 1 hdc, 3 dc, skip 1 stitch, 1ss

Point 2: 4 ch, starting in the 2nd ch from the hook: BLO 1ss, 1 sc, 1 hdc, 1ss

Point 3: 7 ch, starting in the 2nd ch from the hook: BLO 1ss, 1 sc, 1 hdc, 3 dc, skip 1 stitch, 1ss

Point 4: 4 ch, starting in the 2nd ch from the hook: BLO 1ss, 1 sc, 1 hdc, 1ss

Point 5: 9 ch, starting in the 2nd ch from the hook: BLO 1ss, 1 sc, 1 hdc, 5 dc, skip 1 stitch, 1ss

Point 6: 4 ch, starting in the 2nd ch from the hook: BLO 1ss, 1 sc, 1 hdc, 1ss

Point 7: 7 ch, starting in the 2nd ch from the hook: BLO 1ss, 1 sc, 1 hdc, 3 dc, skip 1 stitch, 1ss

Point 8: 4 ch, starting in the 2nd ch from the hook: BLO 1ss, 1 sc, 1 hdc, 1ss





To join both pieces, slip stitch (sl st) taking only the back loops (BLO) of each chain of both pieces, joining them as you go. See the video for more details.
