This amigurumi is worked with tight V-shaped and spiral stitches. Do not close off each row unless indicated; make sure to always mark the beginning of each row. Please read the entire pattern before starting. We have a tutorial on our channel to make this amigurumi. You can access the links attached to each image if you have any questions. If you find any errors in this pattern, please contact me.



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This amigurumi measures approximately 13cm in height and stands on its own.

Materials:

- 100% Mercerized Cotton Thread (Symphony brand), average thickness approximately 3mm. Colors: Tobacco (brown), Fresh Green, Mango Yellow or Gold with 2.5 mm hook
- 1 Buttons or plastic (for the base)
- Wool Needle
- Scissors
- Time marker
- Stuffing for amigurumis
- Glue

Abbreviations:

- R: Round
- ch: chain stitch
- MR: Magic ring
- sc: single crochet
- dec: decrease (close 2 sc together)
- inc: Increase (2sc in 1 stitch)
- dc: double crochet
- hdc: half double crochet
- ss: Slip stitch
- FLO: Front Loop Only (take only the front strand)
- BLO: Back Loop Only (take only the back strand)

Important Note:

This pattern can be adapted to create amigurumi of different sizes using yarn of different thicknesses. Adjust the hook size according to the thickness of the yarn selected.

I hope you enjoy designing this pattern for yourself as much as I did.




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Tree

Start the base using tobacco colored yarn (for the base) R1: MR 8sc R2: 8inc (16) R3: (1sc, 1inc)x8 (24) R4: BLO 24sc https://youtu.be/aYk2oMM7mEs?t=240








R5: (5sc, linc)x4 (28) R6-7: 28sc R8: (6sc, linc)x4 (32) Change to green yarn

To make a color change, follow these steps:

- Finish the last stitch of the round and pull out the yarn over slightly.
 - Insert the hook through the center of the stitch, as shown in the picture.
 - Draw the new color and start the next round.
 - Before finishing this round, pull the strand of the previous color and secure it to the new color with a simple knot.
 - Leave the strands inside the piece so that they become part of the filling.

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R9: FLO (lsc, linc)xl6 (48)

R10: (7sc, 1inc)x6 (54) R11: (8sc, 1inc)x6 (60) R12: BLO 60sc

R13: (7sc, 1triple dec)x6 (48) The triple decrease is very similar to the invisible decrease, with the only difference that, instead of taking two strands



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front strands of the stitches from the previous round, you will take three front strands. Make sure to always work with the front strands from bottom to top, as shown in the images. If you have questions or need a better explanation, you can watch the video where I show you the step by step of this process.

Once you've finished R13, you can attach the button or whatever material you've chosen for the base. This button measures approximately 1 inch, but the size may vary depending on the size of your tree. For added security, I recommend attaching it to the base with hot glue.

R14: (6sc, 1dec)x6 (42) R15: 42sc R16: (5sc, 1dec)x6 (36) R17: 36sc R18: (4sc, 1dec)x6 (30) R19: 30sc R20: (3sc, 1dec)x6 (24) R21: FLO (1sc, 1inc)x12 (36)

Please note that as you progress with the knitting, you should add the stuffing according to your taste. Do not put too much stuffing, as this could affect the shape you have achieved so far.

R22: (5sc, 1inc)x6 (42) R23: (6sc, 1inc)x6 (48) R24: BLO 48sc R25: (5sc, 1triple dec)x6 (36) R26: 36sc R27: (4sc, 1dec)x6 (30) R28: 30sc R29: (3sc, 1dec)x6 (30) R30: 24sc R31: (2sc, 1dec)x6 (12) R32: 18sc R33: (1sc, 1dec)x6 (12) R34: (1sc, 1dec)x4 (8)



When you finish the last round, stuff and cut the thread leaving enough length to close it using a tapestry needle.

Use gold or gold thread Make two equal pieces R1: MR 10sc R2: (1sc, 1inc)x5 (15) P3: 1sc, (4ch, in the 2nd stat




R3: 1sc, (4ch, in the 2nd start BLO 1sc, 1hdc, 1dc, skip 2sts, 1ss)x5

Finish the last slip stitch at the same base as the first one in this round, cut the strand leaving enough to pull it back and secure it with the beginning one. Then, you can cut both strands or leave them as part of the filling. In the shared images, I will indicate which round they belong to.

Repeat the exact same thing one more time, as you need two identical pieces. Then, using only two strands of the same yarn, sew the pieces together. Make sure to position them by joining the backs of each fabric. Do this stitching by only taking the back strands of each stitch. I recommend starting with a slip stitch of each piece, as they are easy to locate. Before completing the closure, add a little bit of stuffing, just enough to give it shape. Then, continue closing, securing it and hiding the strands.
