Important Note:

This amigurumi is worked with tight stitches in a V-shape and spiral pattern. Do not close each row unless instructed to do so. You will need to be careful and always mark the beginning of each row. Please read the entire pattern before starting. In the description before purchasing this pattern we let you know that we have a tutorial on our channel to make this amigurumi.

My Melody measures approximately 18cm in height.

Materials:

- 100% cotton wool (La Abuelita brand).
 Colors: 50g White, Yellow and Girl's
 Pink.
- 2.5mm hook
- Wool Needle
- Scissors
- A strand of finer black and pink yarn for embroidering the face
- Temporary marker
- Pins
- Hot silicone glue (optional).
- Stuffing for amigurumis

Abbreviations:

R: Round

ch: chain

AM: Magic Ring

pb: single crochet

dis: decrease (close 2pb together)

inc: Increase (2sc in 1stc)

dc: double crochet

hdc: half double crochet

ss: slip stitch

FLO: Front Loop Only

BLO: Back Loop Only

You can apply this same method to adjust the size of this amigurumi by using a thicker or thinner yarn. The hook number required will vary based on the yarn chosen.

I trust you will appreciate this design as much as I enjoyed creating it for you.





Piernas (x2)

Use white color yarn

R1: MR 8sc R2: 8inc (16) R3-5: 16sc

Placing melted silicone glue is optional, or you can use a button or cut out a plastic circle, the intention is for it to look flat underneath after placing the filling.

When finishing the first leg, do 1ch to secure and cut the thread (it is not necessary to leave the thread long), when finishing the 2nd leg do not cut the thread to continue with the join.



Union

R6: 4sc, 1ch, 16sc on the other leg, 1sc on the ch, 12sc on the leg we started with (34)

R10: 12 sc, 1 dec, 15 sc, 1 dec, 3 sc (32).

R11: (2 sc, 1 dec) x8 (24).

R12: 24 sc.

R13: (2 sc, 1 dec) x6 (18).


R14-15: 18 sc.

R16: (1 sc, 1 dec) x6 (12).

R17: FLO 12 inc (24).

R18: (1 sc, 1 inc) x12 (36).

R19: (2 sc, 1 inc) x12 (48).

R20: 1 sc, 1 inc, (3 sc, 1 inc) x11, 2 sc (60).

R21-33: 60 sc.

R34: (3 sc, 1 dec) x12 (48).

R35: 48 sc.

R36: (2 sc, 1 dec) x12 (36).

R37: 36 sc.

R38: (1 sc, 1 dec) x12 (24).

R39: 12 dec (12).

R40: 12 sc.

Stuff and close using the yarn needle.

Arms (x2)


Use white yarn

R1: MR 6 sc.

R2: (1 sc, 1 inc) x3 (9).

R3: 4 sc, 1 bobble stitch: 4 hdc closed together in the same stitch, 4 sc (9).

R4-8: 9 sc.

Stuff only at the beginning.

R9: close with 4 sc.

Make 1 ch to secure and cut the yarn, leaving a long tail to attach to the body.

Cola

Use white color yarn

R1: MR 6sc R2-3: 6sc

Leave a long strand to join with the body



Union of the arms with the body:

Sew the arms to the body, making sure they are as close to the base of the head as possible. It is important that the little fingers are facing forward. If you need more details, I suggest you watch the video to guide you through the process.

Tail union:

Make sure to attach the tail to the back of the body. If you need more details, I suggest you check out the video to guide you through the process.

Use yellow thread to embroider the nose.


Embroider it between rows 23 and 24, just above 3 stitches that are as centered as possible on the front of the face. You can make about 6 stitches or as many as you want, depending on how many stitches you make, the volume of the nose will be defined. (See video if necessary)

Eye placement:

Use 1mm thick black thread.

Place each eye about 4 stitches from the nose, between rows 24 and 25. Place the bottom pin between these rows, and the top pin between rows 26 and 27. Stitch as many times as necessary to make the eye an oval; 10 stitches should be enough, as long as you keep arranging the strands. (Refer to the video if necessary.)





Mouth Embroidery:

Embroider the mouth with a single strand of the same thread you used to embroider the eyes. You can do this immediately after embroidering the eyes. It is just one stitch, leaving it a little loose so that it takes the arched shape. For a better understanding, you can access the video.

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Cap

Use pink yarn

R1: MR 6sc R2: 6inc (12)

R3: (1sc, 1inc)x6 (18) R4: (2sc, 1inc)x6 (24)

R5: 1sc, 1inc, (3sc, 1inc)x5, 2sc (30)

R6: (4sc, linc)x6 (36)

R7: 2sc, linc, (5sc, linc)x5, 3sc (42)

R8: (6sc, 1inc)x6 (48)

R9: 3sc, 1inc, (7sc, 1inc)x5, 4sc (54)

R10: (8sc, 1inc)x6 (60)

R11-26: 60sc

Close with yarn needle.

Putting on the cap:

Place the hat on My Melody's head, making sure the back of the hat is as close to the base of the neck as possible. To secure it, you can use glue to secure the seam or sew it on if you prefer a firmer hold.

Ears (x2)

For each ear, make two separate pieces that you will then sew together. Make sure to line them up well before sewing so that they fit together perfectly.

R1: MR 6sc R2: 6inc (12)

R3: (1sc, 1inc)x6 (18) R4: (2sc, 1inc)x6 (24)

R5-9: 24sc

R10: (2sc, 1dec)x6 (18)

R11-14: 18sc

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GretaWings

Tilt the ear. Depending on the yarn you use, it will stay folded perfectly. If not, I recommend placing a pipe cleaner inside so you can shape the ear, as this is a characteristic feature of the character.

Neck Use pink girl yarn Start with 17ch, in the 4th start (1dc, 1inc dc)x7, 3ch, 1ss

Union around the neck:

Leave a long tail when you finish this piece, as you will use it to sew it together and join it (you could also glue it if you prefer). Secure this detail around the neck, making sure to leave a gap in the front.

Flower

Using white yarn

MR (3ch, 2dc, 3ch, 1ss)x5, cut the thread at the end and remove it to the back, inside the MR.

Then, close the MR and, with both threads, tie them to secure the join.

Center

Use yellow yarn MR 6sc.

Cut the thread leaving enough

length to make a perfect closure using the tapestry needle. For a better understanding, see the video. https://youtu.be/u6Hkj-iULHk?t=1995

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


Joining the flower to the head:

Using glue, attach the center of the flower to the base, then glue the formed flower to the head.
