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You can sell the finished product of your amigurumi however you prefer. If you decide to sell your finished product online, please include a link to our website in the description. This way, you'll also be supporting our project.

Important Note:

This amigurumi is worked with tightly knit X and spiral stitches. Do not cast off each row unless indicated; be sure to always mark the beginning of each row. Please read the entire pattern before beginning. We have a tutorial on our channel for making this amigurumi. You can access the links attached to each image if you have any questions. If you find any errors in this pattern, please contact me.



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Toad is approximately 17cm tall.

MATERIALS:

- 100% Mercerized Cotton Thread, average thickness approximately 3mm, has 6 strands. Colors: white, flesh or skin, garnet red, tobacco, turquoise blue, gold,
- with 2.5 mm hook
- 1mm thick black and white thread only for embroidering the eyes.
- Needle to work
- Scissors
- Time marker
- Pins
- Stuffing for amigurumis
- Silicone glue

ABBREVIATIONS:

- R: Round
- ch: chain stitch
- MR: Magic ring
- sc: single crochet
- dec: decrease (close 2 sc together)
- inc: Increase (2sc in 1 stitch)
- dc: double crochet
- hdc: half double crochet
- ss: Slip stitch
- FLO: Front Loop Only (take only the front strand)
- BLO: Back Loop Only (take only the back strand)

Important note:

This pattern can be adapted to create amigurumis of different sizes using different yarn thicknesses. Adjust the crochet hook size according to the yarn thickness you choose. Also consider the size of the safety eyes, if you choose to use them.

I hope you enjoy designing this pattern as much as I do.



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ARMS (X2)

Use flesh-colored yarn

R1: MR 6sc

R2: (1sc, 1inc)x3 (9)

R3-13: 9sc

Note: Add stuffing only at the beginning of the arm

R14: 4sc joining both sides

1c to secure Cut the thread, you do not need to leave it long since the union to the body will not be with seams.

BODY

Start by using white colored thread.

R1: MR 6sc

R2: 6inc (12)

R3: (1sc, 1inc)x6 (18)

R4: (2sc, 1inc)x6 (24)

R5: (3sc, 1inc)x6 (30)

R6: 2sc, 1inc, (4sc, 1inc)x5, 2sc (36)

R7: (5sc, 1inc)x6 (42)

R8: 3sc, 1inc, (6sc, 1inc)x5, 3sc (48)

R9-13: 48sc

R14: (6sc, 1dec)x6 (42)

R15-16: 42sc

R17: (5sc, 1dec)x6 (36)

R18: FLO 36sc

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When you finish R18, cut the thread and make a perfect closure.

I explain to you what a perfect closure is:

- After cutting the yarn, remove it and attach a yarn needle.
- Skip a stitch and, in the next stitch, pass the yarn needle under the chain that forms above the stitch.
- Then, insert the yarn needle just above the last stitch you made.

Whenever a perfect close is mentioned, follow these steps exactly.

Note: We will continue working in a spiral, so recommend placing a marker.

R20: (4sc, 1dec)x6 (30)

R21-22: 30sc

R23: (3sc, 1dec)x6 (24)

CONTINUATION OF THE BODY

Start using flesh or skin colored yarn

R19: BLO 1ch, on the same base start 36sc (36) [link to the video](#)



UNION WITH ARMS

R24: 4sc, 4sc joining the arm, 8sc, 4sc joining the arm, 4sc (24)

Note: It is necessary that the beginning and end of each round always be towards the back, so we will join the arms to each side leaving this closure towards the back, for each arm we will use 4 stitches, always taking one stitch from the arm and one from the body, for a better understanding please watch the step-by-step video tutorial.

R25: (2sc, 1dec)x6 (18)

R26: 18sc

R27: FLO 18inc (36)

R28-34: 36sc

R35: BLO 36sc

R36-37: 36sc

1ch to secure and cut the strand, you don't need it long.

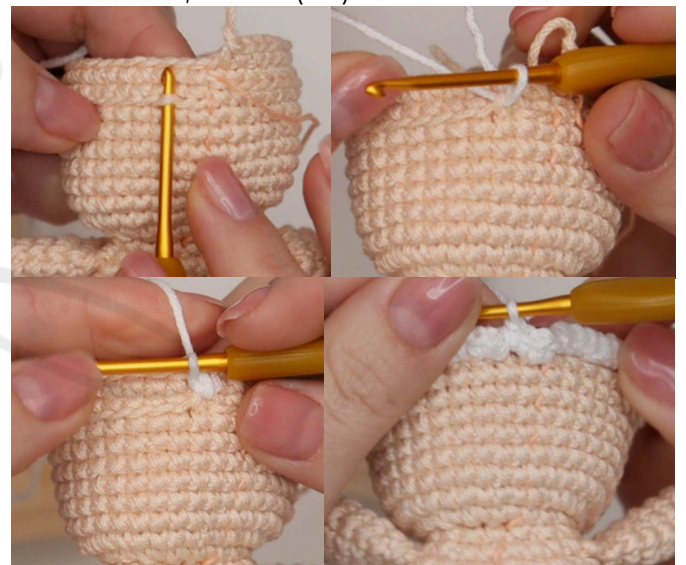
HEAD FUNGUS

Use White yarn.

We will start working on the front strands of R 34 as centered as possible on the back.

R1: FLO 1ch, 36inc (72)

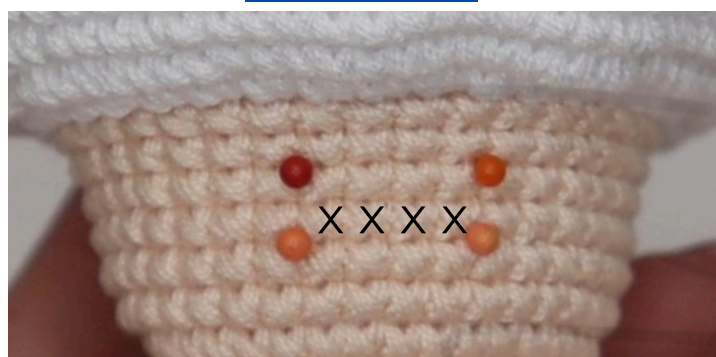
R2-10: 72sc

Embroider the eyes using a yarn needle and 1 mm thick black yarn. For each eye, make 4stitches above R31 and 32 of the head, 4stitches apart. Make sure to position them as centered as possible on the front of your amigurumi. Then, using a 1 mm thick white yarn and just one stitch, make the glitter eye, above and in the center of the previous 4 stitches.

Fill the base of the body up to the head if possible. You can add more stuffing later. For now, place melted silicone glue at the beginning of the white area—not too much. This is just to keep the mushroom from losing its shape when you add stuffing. It's actually optional. For a better understanding, please follow the link to our video.

R11: (7sc, 1dec)x8 (64)

R12-14: 64sc

R15: (6sc, 1dec)x8 (56)

R16: 56sc

R17: 2sc, 1dec, (5sc, 1dec)x7, 3sc (48)

R18: (4sc, 1dec)x8 (40)

R19: 1sc, 1dec, (3sc, 1dec)x7, 2sc (32)

R20: (2sc, 1dec)x8 (24)

R21: (1sc, 1dec)x8 (16)

R22: 16sc



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When you've finished R22, cut the yarn, leaving enough to close off using a yarn needle. Before doing so, make sure you completely stuff your amigurumi.

CIRCLES (X5)

R1: MR 6sc

R2: 6inc (12)

R3: (1sc, 1inc)x6 (18)

R4: (2sc, 1inc)x6 (24)

R5: 1sc, 1inc, (3sc, 1inc)x5, 2sc (30)

When you finish the last round, cut the yarn leaving enough to make an invisible closure.

To position them, first use pins and then glue. The top one, centered on the head closure; the front one, centered on the eyes; the back one, as centered as possible on the back; and for the sides, use the arms as a reference.

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SHOES (X2)

Use Tobacco colored yarn

R1: MR 8sc

R2: 8inc (16)

R3: (1sc, 1inc)x8 (24)

R4: 24sc reverse or BLO

R5: 24sc

R6: 8sc, (1sc, 1inc)x4, 8sc (28)

R7: 28sc

R8: 8sc, (1sc, 1dec)x4, 8sc (24)

R9: 4sc, (1sc, 1dec)x5, 5sc (19)

R10: 19sc

After finishing the last round, cut the yarn, leaving enough to attach it to the body base. You'll need to place the shoe base on a flat surface to apply the silicone glue. Place them firmly in place, as the final result will be as smooth as the silicone glue cools and hardens. If you'd like to replace the melted silicone glue with a plastic base that you cut yourself, that would be great too. The important thing is to make sure they're flat underneath so the amigurumi is stable.



To position the feet on the body, you need to use pins and then sew. For a better understanding, please watch the video [link to the video](#)



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JACKET

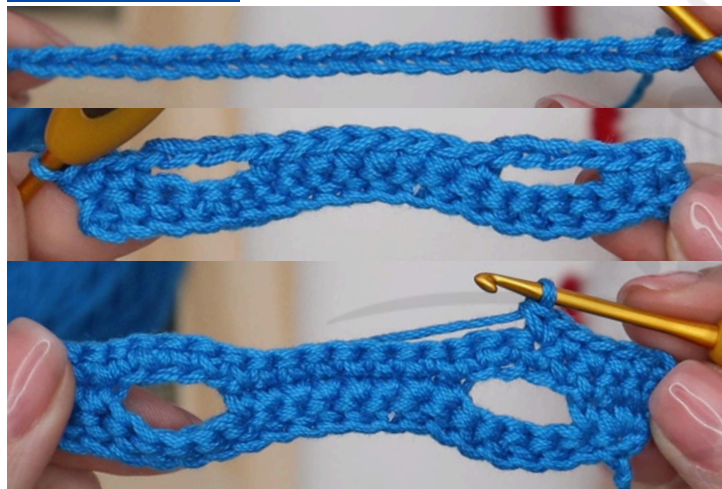
Start using Turquoise blue yarn

R1: 21ch, in the 2nd stiche start 20sc (20)

R2: turn, 1inc, 1sc, 4c, skip 4sts, 8sc, 4c, skip 4sts, 1sc, 1inc (22)

R3: turn, 1inc, 20sc, 1inc (24)

R4: turn (5sc, 1inc)x4 (28)

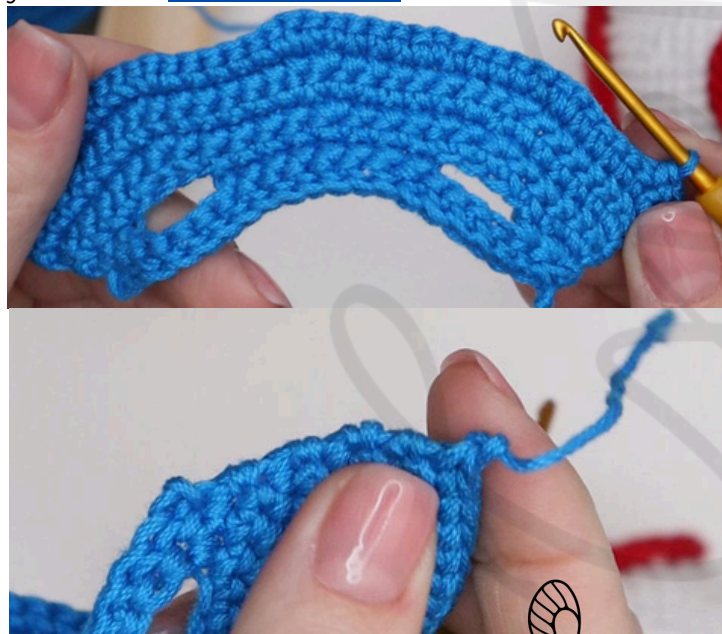
R5: turn (6sc, 1inc)x4 (32)

R6: turn (7sc, 1inc)x4 (36)

R7: turn (5sc, 1inc)x6 (42)

R8-10: turn, 42sc

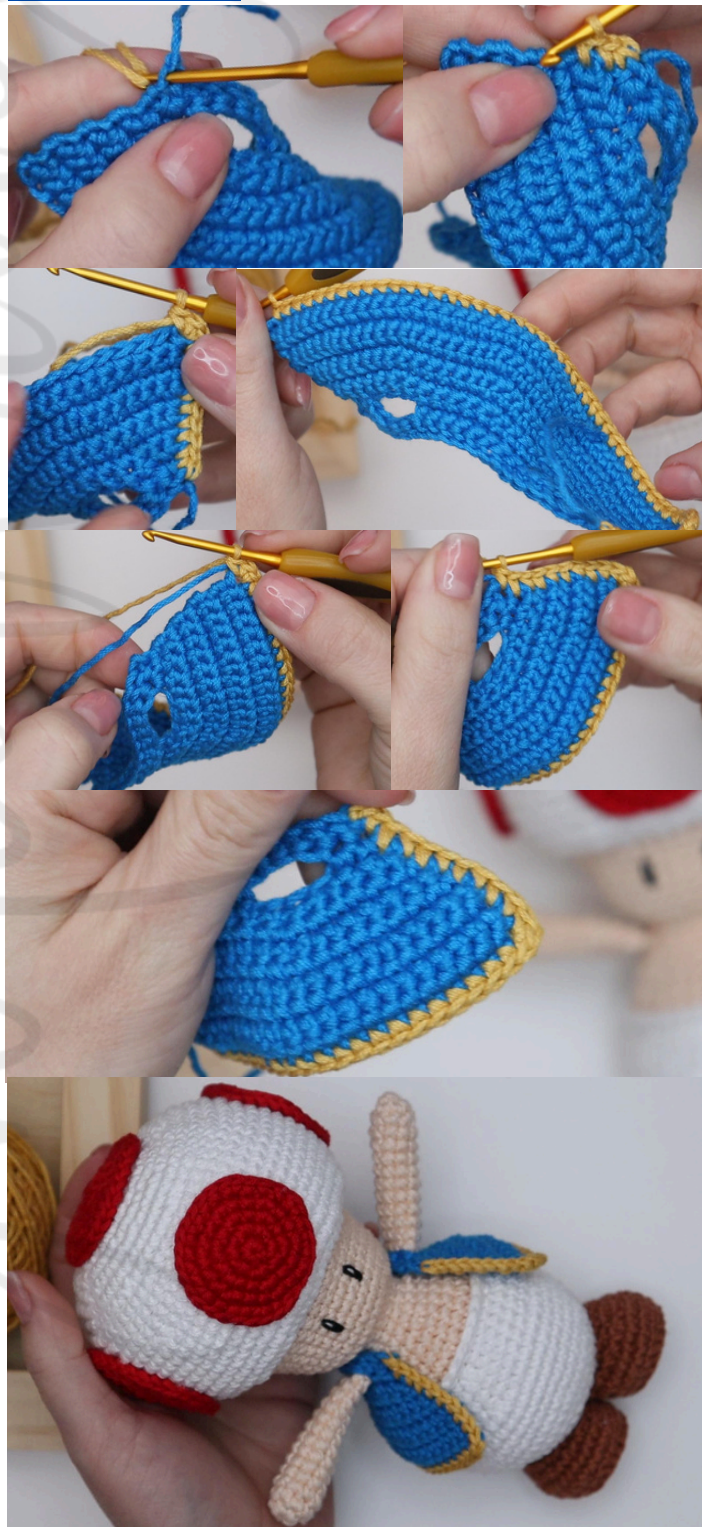
When finished, make a chain and break the yarn. [link to the video](#)



GOLD THREADED EDGE

Start by removing yarn over and 1 ch, in the next stitch start making 9 sc, in the corner 1triple inc, 40 sc, 1 triple inc, 9 sc, 1ch.
