This amigurumi is worked with tightly knit V-shaped and spiral stitches. Do not cast off each row unless indicated; be sure to always mark the beginning of each row. Please read the entire pattern before beginning.

We have a tutorial on our channel for making this amigurumi. You can access the links attached to each image if you have any questions. If you find any errors in this pattern, please contact me.



This Cuqui measures approximately  
8 inches (20cm) tall.

#### MATERIALS:

- We have used 100% mercerized cotton thread, it measures approximately 3 mm thick and has 6 strands, in the colors: Flesh or skin (30g), white, black, royal blue, red (strawberry), yellow (mango), lilac and leaf green, with a 2.5 mm hook
- 1mm thick thread (strands only) in black and red for eyebrow and mouth embroidery.
- Super fine black thread (sewing thread) just for embroidering the eyes.
- Needle to work
- Scissors
- Time marker
- Pins
- Stuffing for amigurumis
- Velcro for hair
- Button to close the dress
- glue

#### ABBREVIATIONS:

- R: Round
- ch: chain stitch
- MR: Magic ring
- sc: single crochet
- dec: decrease (close 2 sc together)
- inc: Increase (2sc in 1 stitch)
- dc: double crochet
- hdc: half double crochet
- ss: Slip stitch
- FLO: Front Loop Only (take only the front strand)
- BLO: Back Loop Only (take only the back strand)

#### Important Note:

This pattern can be adapted to create amigurumis of different sizes using yarns of varying thicknesses. Adjust the hook size according to the thickness of the yarn you choose. Also consider the size of the safety eyes if you choose to use them.

I hope you enjoy designing this pattern for you as much as I did.



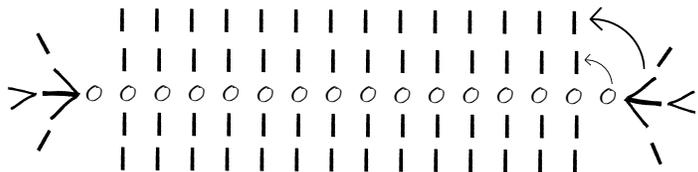
**BODY**

Use flesh or skin colored thread.

Start with 1 sliding knot

R1: 16ch, in the 2nd start, (14sc, 1triple-inc)x2 (34)

R2: 15sc, 1inc, 16sc, 1inc, 1sc (36)

R3-5: 36sc

R6: 15sc, 1dec, 16sc, 1dec, 1sc (34)

✦ Note: It's normal for the body to lean slightly due to the spiral pattern. Don't worry, as this will correct itself when we add the filling.

Throughout the body, whether in rounds with increases or decreases, there will always be two. It's essential to follow the pattern instructions, but if you notice that the increases or decreases aren't aligned well on the sides, you can make slight adjustments to the rounds. This is because each person knits with a different tension, which can slightly tilt the stitches.

If you notice that your knitting leans more than expected, it doesn't mean it's wrong, but in that case, you can adjust the beginning and end of each round. If your knitting is straight, continue the pattern without changes.

A helpful tip is to clearly identify the sides of the fabric and mark them with temporary markers before working the rounds with increases or decreases. This will help you maintain a balanced structure.

♦ Note: The same goes for triple increases and decreases, which must be well aligned to maintain the symmetrical shape of the body.

♦ Note: When you've finished the body, cut the yarn and pull it through, leaving enough yarn to close the opening with a tapestry needle. Make sure to spread the stitches evenly when casting off to maintain a neat, even shape.

#### ARMS (X2)

- R1: MR 6sc
- R2: 6sc
- R3: 2sc, 1bobble st: 4hdc, 3sc (6)
- R4-18: 6sc

♦ Note: The bobble stitch consists of making 4 half double crochets (hdc) in the same base and casting them off together. If you prefer, you can also make it with 3 half double crochets for a more compact finish.

## LEGS (X2)

R1: MR 8sc

R2: (3sc, 1inc)x2 (10)

R3-4: 10sc

R5: (3sc, 1dec)x2 (8)

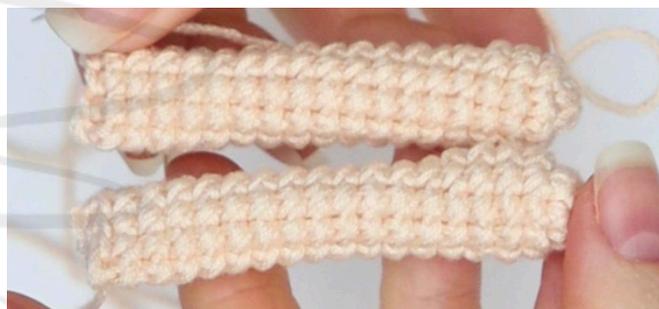
R6-18: 8sc

At the end of each arm, cut the yarn, leaving enough yarn to close the opening with a tapestry needle, making a tapestry binding from side to side. These arms are not stuffed, so this type of binding will help maintain their proper shape.

Note: The legs are sewn in the same way as the arms, passing the thread from side to side with a wool needle. Unlike the arms, the legs are stuffed, and you can add as much as you prefer. I have chosen to leave approximately 6 rounds without stuffing so that they are more flexible and allow better movement.



Let's start stuffing the body, keeping in mind that this doll doesn't need to be as firm as traditional amigurumis. Add enough stuffing to give it shape, but don't overdo it, so that it's soft and comfortable even for the little ones in the house.

Once stuffed, use a yarn needle to close completely, taking a strand from each side to achieve a clean, even finish.

We will join the legs right in the center of the base of the body. Our guide will be the small holes left after making R1. For correct placement, count three holes inward from the base of the triple increases.

Each strand of each leg should be pulled back to the same central point. This way, you can secure them together and then easily hide the strands, achieving a firm and clean join.

Join the arms approximately between R18 and R19, making sure to place them symmetrically on each side of the body. Use the excess thread from each arm to sew them together with a tapestry needle, securing them well so that they are firm but still have some mobility.

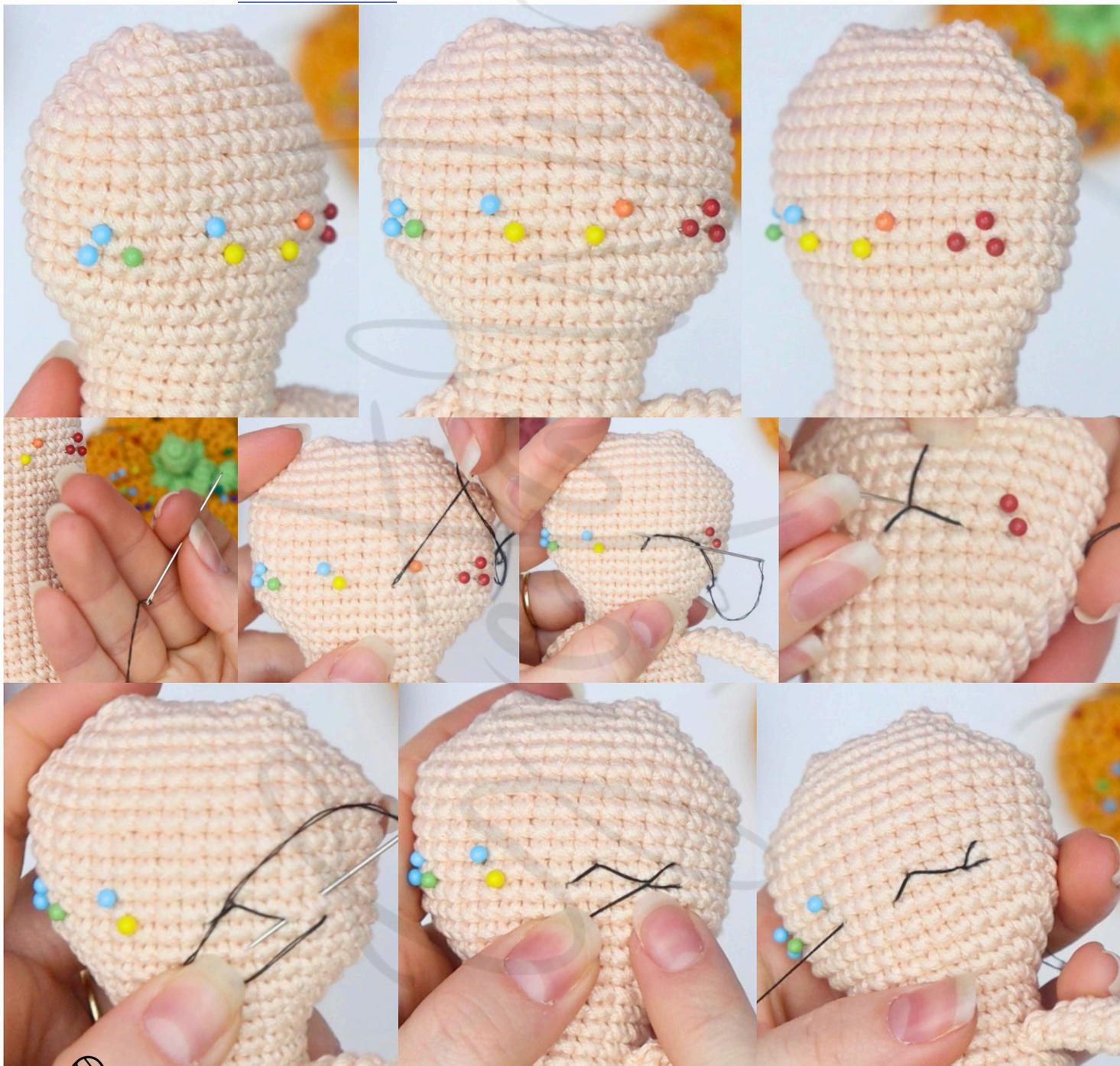

Let's embroider the eyes following the pin guide. The yellow pins are located between R27 and R28, with three points of separation between them and as centered as possible on the face. Place the rest of the pins according to the reference and follow the guide in the images for greater precision.

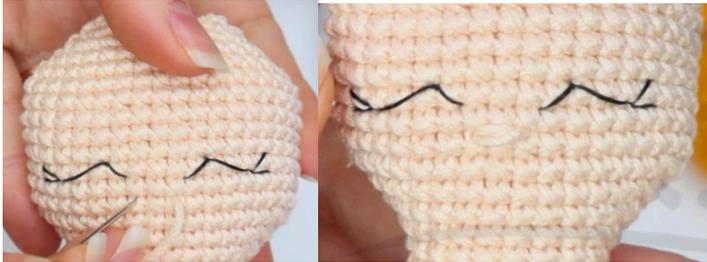
Embroider the eyes using a double strand of black sewing thread to achieve a more defined finish. For a more detailed understanding, we invite you to enjoy our explanatory video.

Embroider the nose between rows 26 and 27, making only three stitches with the same flesh-colored yarn. When you're done, don't cut the thread, as you'll be able to use it to embroider the ears next.

Embroider each ear between R28 and R29, 2 stitches apart from each eye. For this technique, we will use the worm stitch or rococo stitch, which consists of turning the thread around the tapestry needle 10 times before passing it through the fabric. Make sure you hold the worm firmly with your fingertips before pulling the needle to maintain its shape.

Adding blush to the cheeks is optional. If you want a softer, more expressive finish, you can apply it gently with powder blush, fabric paint, or pastel pencils. Adjust the intensity to your preference to give your doll a special touch.

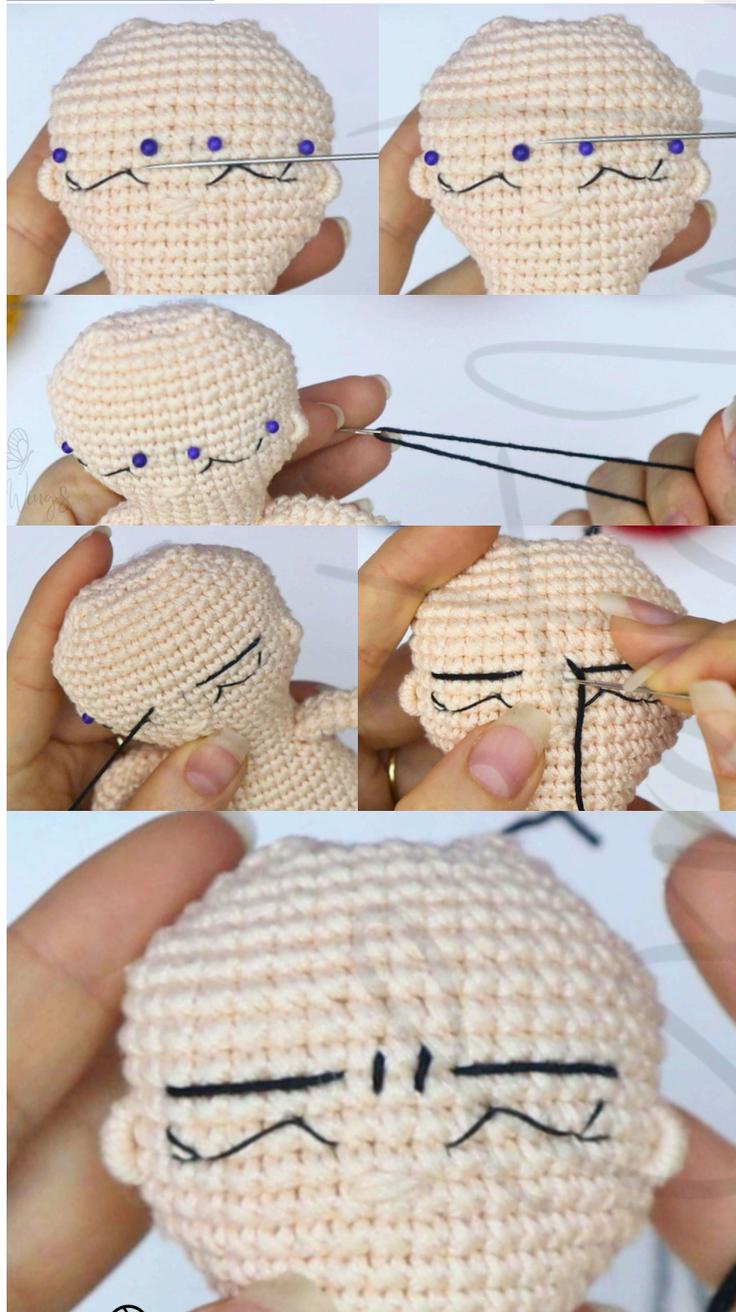

To embroider the eyebrows, use a 1 mm thick black thread or a little more if you want them to stand out.

- Embroider each eyebrow a round above the eyes.
- Each one must cover 4 points, with 3 points separating them.
- First, make two straight stitches and then two vertical stitches, making sure they are as centered as possible.

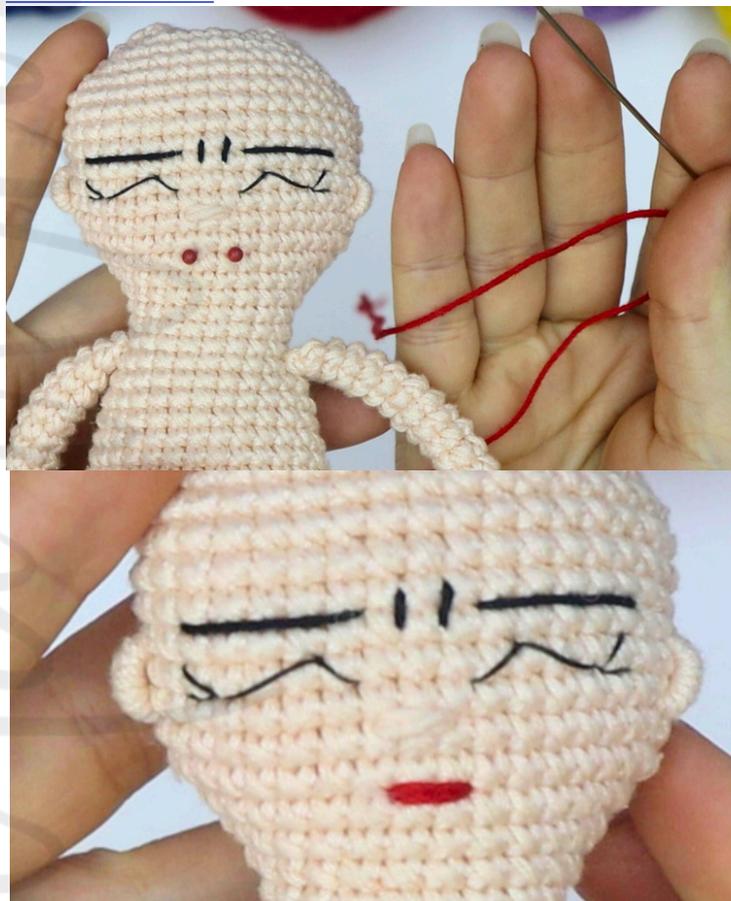

For the lips, embroider two rounds below the nose, right in the center.

- Use red thread with a thickness of 1 mm or a little more if you prefer the color to stand out.
- Make two stitches over 2 stitches wide.

#### ROSE

Use colored threads:  
blue, red, yellow and lilac.

Start with 1 slip knot

12ch, in the 4th start 3dc, 1ch, skip 1st, 1sc  
(2ch, 3dc, 1ch, skip 1st, 1sc)x3

R2: 1ch, 12dc-inc, 1ss (24)  
 R3: 1ch, (1dc, 1dc-inc)x12, 1ss (36)  
 R4: 1ch, 15dc, 1hdc, 1sc, 2ss, 1sc, 1hdc, 15dc, 1ss  
 R5: 1ch, 14dc, 2hdc, 1sc, 2ss, 1sc, 2hdc, 14dc, 1ss

When you're done, cut the thread and tuck it away. To form the roses, simply roll the strip of fabric into a spiral from one end. As you roll, apply a little glue to the base to help it hold its shape. It's a very easy step, and the result is beautiful.

### HAIR

Use black color yarn.  
 (although you will see the images in lilac)  
 R1: MR 2ch, 12dc, 1ss (12)

Make a perfect closure using a wool needle

I explain to you what a perfect closure is:

- After cutting the yarn, remove it and attach a yarn needle.
- Skip a stitch and, in the next stitch, pass the yarn needle under the chain that forms above the stitch.
- Then, insert the yarn needle just above the last stitch you made.

Whenever a perfect close is mentioned, follow these steps exactly.

◆ Using a strand of the same yarn and a yarn needle, make two stitches in the front of the hair, making sure to center it as much as possible. Secure and tuck the strands inside. [link to the video](#)

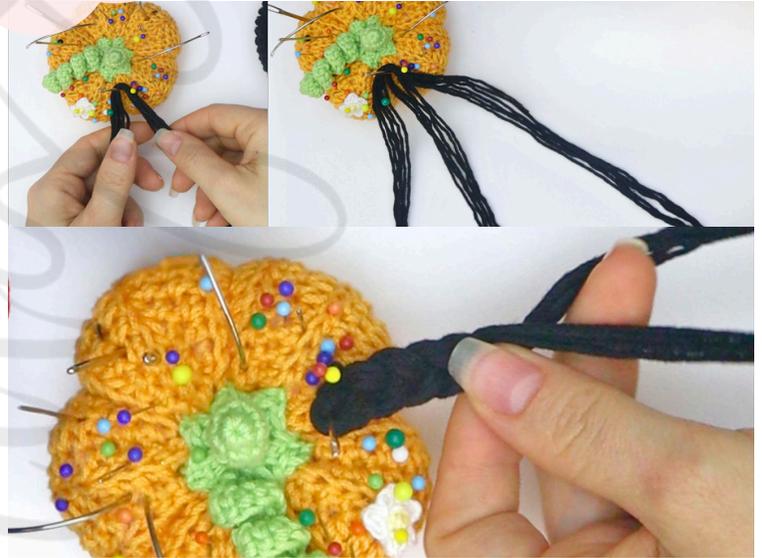


To make the braid, you are going to cut 9 strands of black yarn, each about 65 cm (25 inches).

Then, fold them in half and secure them tightly, separating them into 3 groups of 6 strands each. Now all you have to do is weave a traditional braid.

If you have any questions, don't worry, you can follow the detailed instructions in the video tutorial. Once the braid is the length you want, you can cut off the excess thread.

To find the ideal braid length, first place the two center flowers. You can glue or sew them, whichever is easier for you.

Then, start gluing the braid on each side, following your hairline. When you reach the other end, simply cut the remaining thread and continue gluing.

Finally, place the other two flowers just above each end to hide the cuts and create a perfect finish. Remember, the color order is entirely up to you! [link to the video](#)



◆ Optional: For a more secure hold without losing the ability to remove your hair, you can add a small piece of Velcro to the head and another to the hair. Secure it with glue to ensure a better fit and make it easier to apply.

#### SHOES (X2)

Use black color

R1: MR 8sc

R2: (1sc, 1inc)x4 (12)

R3: (5sc, 1inc)x2 (14)

R4-5: 14sc

R6: 5sc, 4ch, skip 4sts, 5sc (14)

R7: 6sc, 2inc, 6sc (16)

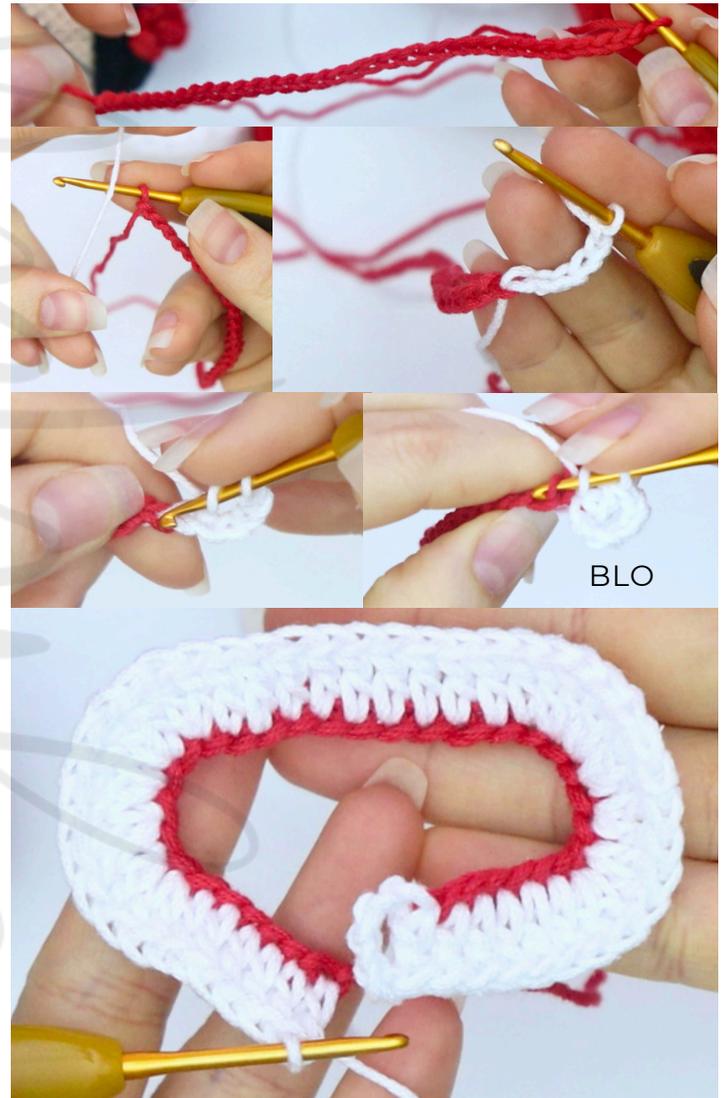
#### DRESS

For the skirt, the images you'll see in the pattern are with royal blue yarn, but you can use black yarn if you prefer. It's the exact same design, just a different color!

Start using red yarn

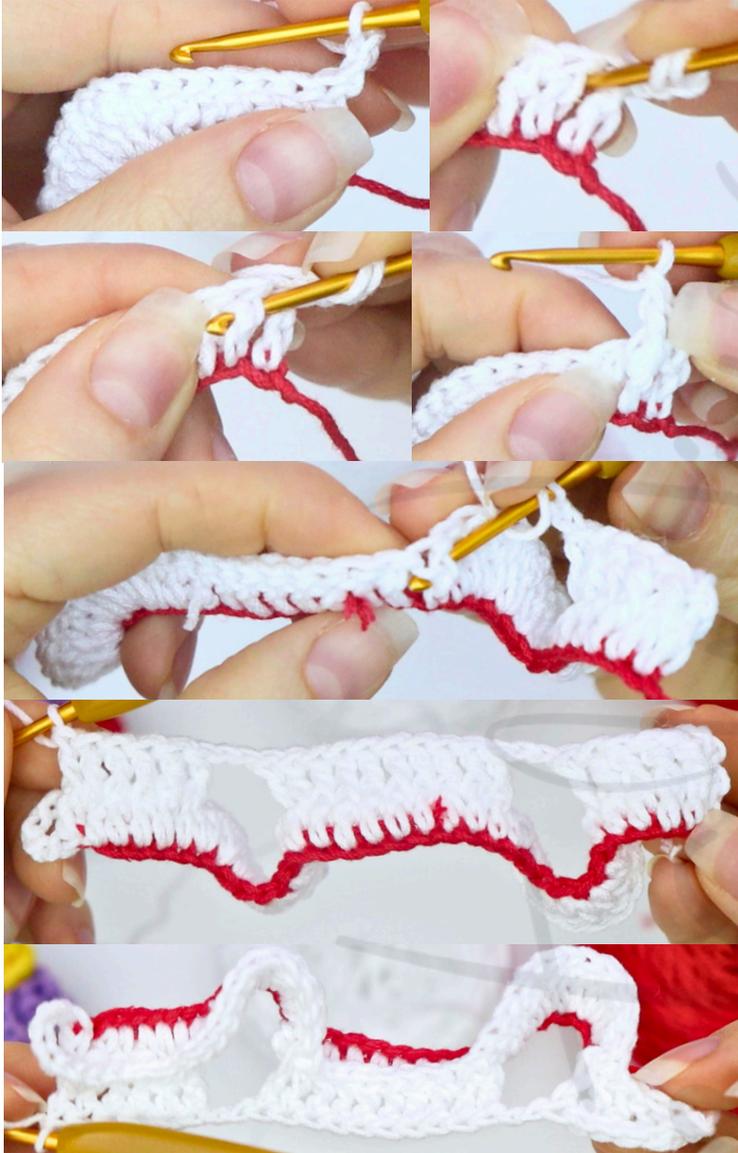
R1: 34ch, in chain #34 change to white yarn and make 6ch more, starting in chain #34 1dc, BLO 5dc more, 6inc-dc, 10dc, 6inc-dc, 6dc (36)

R2: 2ch, turn, in relief 5dc, 2ch, skip 12sts,  
10dc, 2ch, skip 12sts, 6dc (26)

R3: 2ch, turn, 1dc in the same base, 24dc,  
1inc-dc (28)

Change to blue yarn in the last dc of this R.

R4: 1ch, turn 28sc (28) [link to the video](#)



R5: 2ch, turn, (1dc, 1dc-inc)x14, 1ss (42)

R6-11: 2ch, on the same base start 42dc, 1ss

Using white color yarn

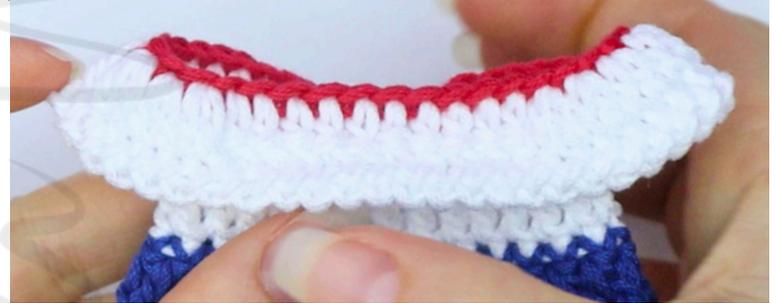
R13: BLO(1ch, 1ss)x42

When finished, pull the strand back, secure it and hide it. [link to the video](#)



Place the dress in the position shown in the picture and insert your hook into the first dc of the flare. Then repeat (ch 1, k1) around the entire edge. Leave a long strand at the beginning so you can adjust the flare of the dress later. When you're working, be sure to keep that strand in. When you've finished the edge, adjust the flare to your liking and secure both strands.

Between rows 10 and 11, chain or slip stitch in red, working from the inside out. When you're done, pull the starting strand back in, secure, and tuck it away. [link to the video](#)

Embroider details on the dress, for a better understanding watch the videos in the shared links, make flowers in the colors you want, I suggest you use the same ones as the roses that I put in the hair, in the yellow flowers make the center in white and in the others the center in yellow, that center is a stitch in embroidery known as rococo, then with a leaf green thread, embroider the leaves, two for each flower.

Finally, add a button to close the dress.
