Important Note:

This amigurumi is worked with tightly knit X and spiral stitches. Do not cast off each row unless indicated; be sure to always mark the beginning of each row. Please read the entire pattern before beginning. We have a tutorial on our channel for making this amigurumi. You can access the links attached to each image if you have any questions. If you find any errors in this pattern, please contact me.



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Tom the cat is approximately
18cm (7 inches) tall.

MATERIALS:

- We have used 100% mercerized cotton thread, it measures approximately 1mm thick and has 5 strands, in the colors: White, steel (gray), gray (lighter), salmon (pink), black, straw (yellow) and green, with a 1.5mm needle.
- 0.85mm hook, for knitting eyes with just one strand of the same yarn.
- Needle to work
- Scissors
- Time marker
- Stuffing for amigurumis
- Hot silicone glue
- Wire (to articulate legs, arms and head) (optional)
- super fine wire for ear edging (22 gauge)
- black felt for the mouth and nose and red for the tongue

ABBREVIATIONS:

- R: Round
- ch: chain stitch
- MR: Magic ring
- sc: single crochet
- dec: decrease (close 2 sc together)
- inc: Increase (2sc in 1 stitch)
- dc: double crochet
- hdc: half double crochet
- ss: Slip stitch
- FLO: Front Loop Only (take only the front strand)
- BLO: Back Loop Only (take only the back strand)

Important note:

This pattern can be adapted to create amigurumis of different sizes using different yarn thicknesses. Adjust the crochet hook size according to the yarn thickness you choose. Also consider the size of the safety eyes, if you choose to use them.

I hope you enjoy designing this pattern as much as I do.



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PIERNAS (X2)

Start using white color yarn.

Start with 1 slip knot.


R1: 6ch, in the 2nd place

(4sc, 1triple-inc)x2 (14)

R2: (4sc, 3inc)x2 (20)

R3: 5sc, 4inc, 6sc, 4inc, 1sc (28)

R4: BLO 4sc

R5-6: 5sc, 8hdc, 15sc (28)


R7: 3sc, 6hdc-dec, 13sc (22)



When you finish R7, firmly stuff only the front of the feet. Prepare a wire to place inside each leg. The wires are approximately 14 inches (35.5 cm) long and should be folded in half.

Optional tip: For added stability, you can place hot melt glue on the heel before inserting the wire. If not, stuff the foot and then insert the wire. Your amigurumi will stand on its own, supported by its tail.

Tip: When knitting two identical pieces, such as the legs, make sure you do them on the same day. This way, they'll be as similar as possible, since we don't knit with the same tension every day.




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R8: 1sc, 5dec, 5sc, 1dec, 4sc (16)

When you have finished R8, stuff the toe more if necessary. Using a black yarn (it can be the same as the one you used for the amigurumi or a 1 mm thick one) and a yarn needle, make two stitches to mark the cat's hooves. For a better understanding, watch the tutorial video.

R9: (2sc, 1dec)x4 (12)


Change to steel (gray) yarn in the last decrease.

Every time you need to make a color change, follow these steps:

- Finish the last stitch of the round and pull the yarn over slightly.
- Insert the hook through the center of the stitch, as shown in the image.
- Draw the new color and start the next round.
- Before finishing this round, pull the strand of the previous color and secure it to the new color with a simple knot.
- Leave the strands inside the piece so they become part of the filling.

I won't go into this explanation any further. From now on, whenever you make a color change, do it this way with the corresponding colors.


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R10: 12sc

Note: In this R10, you will alternate 1 regular single crochet and then 1 elongated single crochet, which is made by inserting the hook into R9. Watch the video for a better understanding.

R11: (2sc, 1inc)x4 (16)

R12: 4sc, 2inc, 5sc, 2dec, 1sc (16)

R13: 5sc, 2inc, 5sc, 2dec (16)

R14: 5sc, 2dec, 5sc, 2inc (16)

R15: 4sc, 2dec, 5sc, 2inc, 1sc (16)

R16: (3sc, 1inc)x4 (20)

R17: 20sc

R18: (4sc, 1inc)x4 (24)

R19: 24sc

R20: (5sc, 1inc)x4 (28)


R21: 28sc

When you've finished R21, cut the thread and make a perfect closure. I'll explain what a perfect closure is:

- After cutting the yarn, remove it and attach a yarn needle.
- Skip a stitch and, in the next stitch, pass the yarn needle under the chain that forms above the stitch.
- Then, insert the yarn needle just above the last stitch you made.

Whenever a perfect close is mentioned, follow these steps exactly.



ARMS (X2)

LITTLE FINGER (X2)

Use white color yarn

R1: MR 4sc

R2: 4sc

Cut the thread and remove it. It doesn't need to be long. [link to the video](#)



R5: 12sc

R6: 4sc on little finger, 12sc (16)

R7: (2sc, 1dec)x4 (12)

R8: (4sc, 1dec)x2 (10)

When finishing R8, prepare the wire. Add melted silicone glue to your hand, place the wire, wait for it to cool, then continue.

Big fingers (x6)

Use white color yarn


R1: MR 4sc

R2-3: 4sc

You will make 3 fingers for each hand. When you finish the first two, break the yarn. On the third finger, do not break the yarn so you can continue joining in the next round.

R4: 2sc, 2sc on another finger, 4sc on the third finger, 2sc on the middle finger and 2 more sc on the finger you started this round with (12)

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R9: 10sc. In the last single crochet, change to steel (gray) colored yarn.

R10: 10 sc. Note: In this round, you will alternate 1 regular single crochet and 1 elongated single crochet, which is worked by inserting the hook into R9. Watch the video for a better understanding.

R11: 10sc

R12: (4sc, 1inc)x2 (12)

R13: (5sc, 1inc)x2 (14)

R14-22: 14sc

When finished, make an invisible cast-off and add stuffing. [link to the video](#)

COLA

Start using white color yarn.

R1: MR 6sc

R2: 6sc



R3: (2sc, 1inc)x2 (8)

R4-8: 8sc. In the last sc of R8, change to steel (gray) colored yarn.

R9: 8sc.

Note: In this round, you'll alternate between 1 regular single crochet and 1 extended single crochet, which is made by inserting the hook into row 9. Watch the video for a better understanding. [link to the video](#)

R10-24: 8 sc When finished, cut the yarn, leaving enough to sew to the body. Also, prepare the wire and insert it; this time, you don't need to secure it with silicone glue.



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BODY

Use steel colored yarn (gray)

R1: MR 8sc

R2: 8inc (16)

R3: (1sc, 1inc)x8 (24)

R4: 3sc, 6sc joining 1 leg, 6sc,
6sc joining another leg, 3sc (56)

Make sure the front of the legs always face the same direction. For a better understanding of this joint, please watch our video.

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
R5: 56sc

Make sure to skip the single crochet stitches you made for the leg cuff; you should not work over them. [link to the video](#)



Be sure to fill the body as you go and join the wires together to form the structure.

R6: (8sc, 1dec)x2, 14sc, (1dec, 8sc)x2, 8sc (52)

R7-9: 52sc

R10: 12sc, 1dec, 24sc, 1dec, 12sc (50)

R11: (7sc, 1dec)x2, 14sc, (1dec, 7sc)x2 (46)

R12: 46sc



R13: 11sc, 1dec, 21sc, 1dec, 10sc (44)

R14-15: 44sc


R16: (9sc, 1dec)x4 (40)

R17: 40sc

R18: (1dec, 8sc)x4 (36)

R19-32: 36sc

When you finish row 32, place the tail as centered as possible on the back of the body, between rows 11 and 12. To aid in wire insertion, you can insert the hook first. Once the wire is in, join it with the wires in the center of the body. Finally, use the yarn needle to sew the tail to the body. [link to the video](#)



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Then, move the tail until your amigurumi stands perfectly on the table.

For a perfect arm join, determine the ideal side for each arm. The technique is the same as the one used for the legs. Although the image shows only one pin, it marks the center of the four stitches you'll use for the join. Pay close attention to ensure that the thumb of each hand always faces the front of your amigurumi.


R33: 10sc, 4sc joining 1 arm, 14sc, 4sc joining another arm, 4sc (48)

R34-39: 48sc

When you've finished R39, bend the wires along the knitting needles and then gather them all together in the center. The excess wire will stay inside the head. [link to the video](#)



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Continue filling as you go, before the piece closes.
Place filler around the wire in the neck area if necessary.

If you've decided not to use a wire in your neck, it's important to add support. If you're using a material similar to mine, a small silicone tube is the perfect size for this neck and could provide support for your head.

Before finishing the head, you'll need to cut or bend the excess wire. Once you've finished all the rounds, stuff the head and close it using a yarn needle.

DETAIL OF THE CHEST.

Use light gray color yarn.

Start by making 1 slip knot

R1: 9ch, in the 2nd start 8sc (8)

R2: 1ch, turn, 1inc, 6sc, 1inc (10)

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


R3: 1ch, turn, 1inc, 8sc, 1inc (12)
 R4-5: 1ch, turn, 12sc (12)
 R6: 1ch, turn, 1dec, 8sc, 1dec (10)
 R7: 1ch, turn, 10sc
 R8: 1ch, turn, 1dec, 6sc, 1dec (8)
 R9-14: 1ch, turn, 8sc
 R15: 1ch, turn, 1inc, 6sc, 1inc (10)
 R16-21: 1ch, turn, 10sc
 R22: 1ch, turn, 1sc, 1hdc, 1dc-inc, 1hdc, 2ss,
 1hdc, 1dc-inc, 1hdc, 1inc, 20sc on the side,
 2sc, 1hdc, 2hdc-inc, 1hdc, 2sc,
 20sc on the other side,
 1 more sc in the base of the 1st of this round

When finished, make an invisible closure.
 Position the detail on the front of your amigurumi
 with pins and then join it completely with glue.



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SNOUT

Use white color yarn

R1: MR 6sc

R2: 6inc (12)

R3-10: 12sc

R11: 6dec (6)

When finished, stuff and fasten with a yarn needle. Then, with a strand of the same white color, hold it in the center to shape the snout. You can tuck the remaining strands, making sure they are hidden when you join the snout to the head.

LOWER LIP

Start using steel-colored (gray) yarn

R1: MR 6sc


R2: 6inc (12)

R3-6: 12sc In the last sc of R6 change to white.

R7-27: 12sc In the last sc of R27 change to steel (gray) yarn

IMPORTANT: When finishing R7, it is necessary to fill only the gray area and seal it using only two strands of the same yarn. Watch the video for a better understanding.



R28-31: 12sc

IMPORTANT: The white area does not need to be filled. When finishing R31, it's necessary to seal using only two strands of the same thread. Watch the video for a better understanding.

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
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R32: 6dec

Fill and close using a wool needle.

UNION


R10: 1ch, in the same base start 8sc,

5sc between R1 and 2,

8 more sc on the other side, 1ch to secure,

leave the tail long to sew to the head later.

EARS (X2)

Make 4 equal triangles for the ears.

- 2 salmon-colored triangles: When you finish each one (from R1 to R9), cut the thread without leaving it long.
- 2 triangles in light grey: When you finish each one (from R1 to R9), do not cut the thread so you can continue with R10. the union.



R1: MR 2sc

R2: 1ch, turn, 2inc (4)

R3: 1ch, turn, 4sc

R4: 1ch, turn, 1inc, 2sc, 1inc (6)

R5: 1ch, turn, 6sc

R6: 1ch, turn, 1inc, 4sc, 1inc (8)

R7: 1ch, turn, 8sc

R8: 1ch, turn, 1inc, 6sc, 1inc (10)

R9: 1ch, turn, 10sc



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OJOS (X2)

To make these eyes, pull out just one strand of each color and work it with a 0.85 mm hook (Tulip #9). For Tom, these should be miniature eyes.

Start knitting with black yarn, even though the video demonstration is with gray yarn.

Start with 1 slip knot

R1: 6ch, in the 2nd start 4sc, 1 triple inc, 4sc, 1sc to secure and cut the yarn

Use green yarn.

Note: Always start with the first single crochet stitch of the previous round. Always knit in the same direction.

R2: 1ch, on the same base start 4sc, 3inc-hdc, 4sc, 1c to secure and cut the thread.

Use straw-colored yarn (yellow)

R3: 1ch, in the same base start, 5sc, (inc: 1hdc and 1dc), 2inc-dc, (inc: 1hdc and 1hdc), 5sc, 1ch to secure and cut the yarn

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When finished, secure the strands behind using silicone glue.

CENTERPIECE BETWEEN THE EYES

Use light gray thread.

Start with 1 slip knot.

R1: 5sc, in the 2nd beg 4sc

R2: 1sc, turn, 4sc, 2sc, BLO 1sc in the 1st, 1sc at the base of the last sc,

4ch, BLO 1dc in the 1st,

1sc in the base of the 1st sc of R1

2ch, BLO 1ss in 1st, 4sc, 1ch to secure.

Cut the strands and hide them.

SMALL HAIRS (X2)

Use steel-colored (gray) thread

Leave the strands long at the beginning and end, as you can later use them to join them to the head.

Start with 1 slip knot.

(4ch, in the 1st BLO 1ss)x3

1ch to secure





CENTER OF HEAD HAIR

Use steel-colored (gray) thread. Leave the strands long at the beginning and end, as you can later use them to join them to the head.

Start with 1 slip knot.
(5ch, in the 1st BLO 1ss)x3
1ch to secure

EYEBROWS (X2)


Use black thread Start with 1 slip knot
5ch, in the 2nd start BLO 4sc When you finish cutting the thread, knot them together and hide them. [link to the video](#)

WE'LL START PUTTING ALL THE PIECES TOGETHER TO BRING TOM TO LIFE.

We want the face to look very cheerful, so to achieve this, please watch our step-by-step video tutorial for each piece.

We'll start with the snout. Center the snout with pins as much as possible on the front of your amigurumi, at the lines R58 and R59. The lower lip follows, matching the color change with each end of the snout. Glue only the beginning of the tongue; the rest should remain above the lip without glue.

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If you have added wire to your ears, it is time to shape them as desired.

To place them, follow these instructions:

- Place them 7 points apart from the center of the head.
- Place them at the height of 9 rounds down from the top.
- Make sure they are also approximately 7 points away from the eyes and mouth.

Once positioned, add glue to the base and sew them together only at the back. The wires will simply remain inside the head.
