## Important Note:

This amigurumi is worked with V-shaped and spiral stitches. Do not cast off each row unless indicated; be sure to always mark the beginning of each row. Please read the entire pattern before beginning. We have a tutorial on our channel for making this amigurumi. You can access the links attached to each image if you have any questions. If you find any errors in this pattern, please contact me.





Gholdengo is approximately 20cm (8 inches) tall.

#### MATERIALS:

- We used 100% Cotton Yarn (3 mm):  
Mango Yellow, Red, Gray and Gold.
- Say (1 mm): Black and Orange.
- Hooks: 2.5 mm and 1.5 mm.
- Needle to work
- Scissors
- Time marker
- Stuffing for amigurumi
- Glue
- brown, black and yellow felt for eyes and mouth

#### ABBREVIATIONS:

- R: Round
- ch: chain stitch
- MR: Magic ring
- sc: single crochet
- dec: decrease (close 2 sc together)
- inc: Increase (2sc in 1 stitch)
- dc: double crochet
- hdc: half double crochet
- ss: Slip stitch
- FLO: Front Loop Only (take only the front strand)
- BLO: Back Loop Only (take only the back strand)

#### Important note:

This pattern can be adapted to create amigurumi of different sizes with varying yarn thicknesses. Adjust the crochet hook size according to the yarn thickness you choose. Also consider the size of the eyes and mouth if you decide to modify them.

I hope you enjoy designing this pattern as much as I did.



## TIPS (X4)

Use 3mm thick yellow yarn with a 2.50mm hook.

R1: MR 8sc

R2: 8inc (16)

R3: (1sc, 1inc)x8 (24)

R4: 24sc reverse

R5-6: 24sc

R7: (4sc, 1dec)x4 (20)

R8: 20sc

R9: (3sc, 1dec)x4 (16)

R10-11: 16sc

R12: (2sc, 1dec)x4 (12)

R13-16: 12pb

After completing the last round, cut the yarn, leaving a long tail of about 20-30 cm so you can sew the piece to the body later. Pull the yarn through the last stitch completely to secure the piece. Stuff the piece evenly with synthetic fiberfill, making sure to add just enough so it maintains its shape. Avoid overstuffing, as this could cause the base to expand and create unwanted bulk and weight.



## PIERNAS (X2)

Use 3mm thick yellow yarn with a 2.50mm hook.

R1: MR 8 sc

R2: 8 inc (16)

R3: (1 sc, 1 inc) x 8 (24)

R4: (2 sc, 1 inc) x 8 (32)

R5: 32 sc reverse

R6-15: 32 sc

When finishing the first leg, cut the yarn leaving a long end to make the invisible closure.

If you don't know how to perform the invisible closure, access the link we shared to see a tutorial. [Link to video](#)



When you finish the second leg, don't cut the yarn. You'll continue crocheting with this same yarn to attach it to the rest of the body. But first, make sure the legs lie flat so this amigurumi can stand on its own.

## UNION

R16: 16 sc, 32 sc on the other leg,

16 more sc on the leg that I started (64)

Note: Don't worry about the center opening; it will be closed with a seam later.

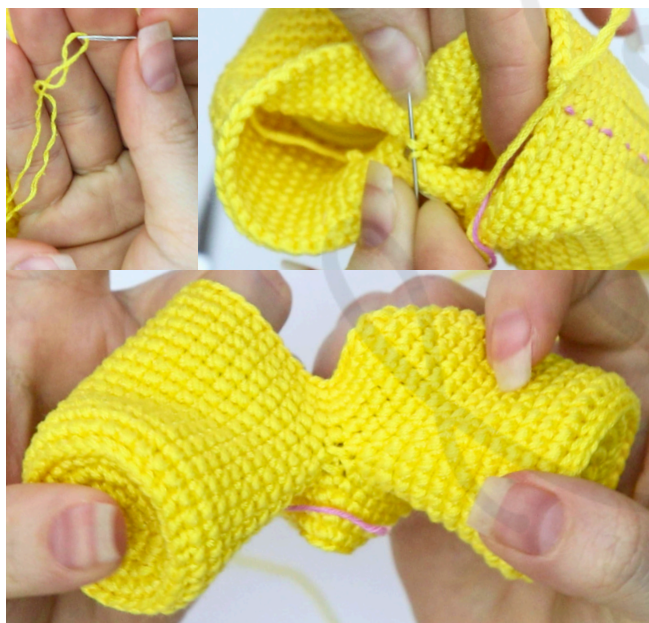

R17-20: 64sc

At the end of R20, close the opening with a tapestry needle and 2 strands of the same yellow yarn, making horizontal stitches from side to side.

Remember to continue filling the piece with synthetic fiber as you progress with the weaving.

R21: (14sc, 1dec)x4 (60)

R22-23: 60sc

R24: (13sc, 1dec)x4 (56)

R25: 56sc

R26: (5sc, 1dec)x8 (48)

R27-28: 48sc

R29: (4sc, 1dec)x8 (40)

R30-32: 40 sc 1inc)x4 (28)

R33: (3sc, 1dec)x8 (32)

R34-37: 32sc

R38: (6sc, 1dec)x4 (28)

R39-41: 28sc

R42: (5sc, 1dec)x4 (24)

R43-46: 24sc

R47: (5sc, 1inc)x4 (28)

R48: 28sc

R49: (6sc, 1inc)x4 (32)

R50: 32sc

R51: (7sc, 1inc)x4 (36)

R52: (8sc, 1inc)x4 (40)

R53-55: 40sc

R56: (9sc, 1inc)x4 (44)

R57-59: 44sc

R60: (10sc, 1inc)x4 (48)

R61: 48sc

At the end of R61, cut the yarn leaving enough for an invisible closure and fill the piece completely.

Circle (head closure)  
Use 3mm thick yellow yarn with a 2.50mm hook.

- R1: RM 8sc
- R2: 8inc (16)
- R3: (1sc, 1inc)x8 (24)
- R4: (2sc, 1inc)x8 (32)
- R5: (3sc, 1inc)x8 (40)
- R6: (4sc 1inc)x8 (48)



- When finished, cut the thread leaving a long end for an invisible closure and attach the piece to the body with a tapestry needle.
- For a better understanding, watch the video:
- Make the join using a yarn needle.
- As you close the piece, you can add more filling if you think it's necessary.

FINGERS (X6)

Use 3mm thick yellow yarn with a 2.50mm hook.

- R1: MR 8 sc
- R2: BLO 8 sc
- R3-6: 8 sc.

When finished, stuff, cut the yarn and fasten off. It is not necessary to leave a long end.

ARM (X2)

Use 3mm thick yellow yarn with a 2.50mm hook.

- R1: MR 6sc
- R2: 6inc (12)

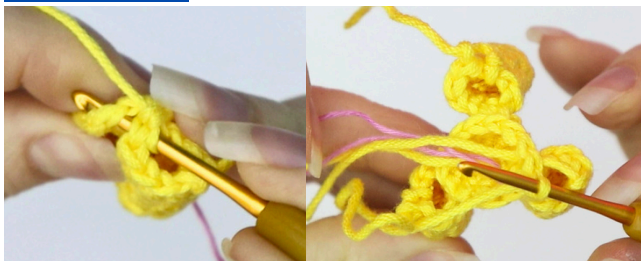

R3: (2sc, 2sc on one finger)x3 (24)

To make the single crochet stitches by connecting them on each finger, it's important to work from the inside out. For a better understanding, please watch the video.

R4-10: 24 sc

Note: At the end of R10, use your finger to push the excess yarn from your fingers to the inside of the arm. When stuffing, make sure you do not push these yarn ends back to the outside. [Link to video](#)

R11: (2sc, 1dec)x6 (18)

R12-13: 18sc

R14: (1sc, 1dec)x6 (12)

R15-24: 12sc

At the end of the last round, cut the yarn leaving enough to close and attach to the body. Before doing so, fill the piece evenly with synthetic fiber, making sure to add just the right amount to maintain its shape.

Using a 1mm thick orange thread, sew the separation lines between the indicated rounds on each piece. For an easier option, you can try gluing the thread in place. However, for greater certainty and a guide on the stitches, please watch the video:

SAFE

PART 1 (LID)

Use red yarn, with a 2.50mm hook

Start with 1 slip knot

R1: 13ch, in the 2nd start 12sc

R2-8: 1ch, turn, 12sc

R9: 5dc in the center of the side, 12ss,  
5dc in the center of the other side,  
1ss to close.

Cut the yarn leaving enough to join to  
the chest later. [Link to video](#)



PART 2 (SIDES AND BASE) (X3)

Use red yarn, with a 2.50mm hook

Start with 1 slip knot

R1: 13ch, in the 2nd start 12sc

R2-4: 1ch, turn, 12sc

1 stitch to secure and cut the thread; it doesn't  
need to be long. [Link to video](#)



PIECE 3 (SIDES AND BASE) (X2)

Use red yarn, with a 2.50mm hook

Start with 1 slip knot.

R1: 5ch, in the 2nd row start 4sc.

R2-4: 1ch, turn, 4sc

1 stitch to secure and cut the thread; it  
doesn't need to be long. [Link to video](#)



## Chest Assembly

1. Using two strands of the same red yarn and a tapestry needle, join the five pieces together to form the base of the chest.
2. Add the gold-colored details to both pieces by making 1 slip stitch or embroidery.
3. Finally, attach the lid to one of the sides of the chest.

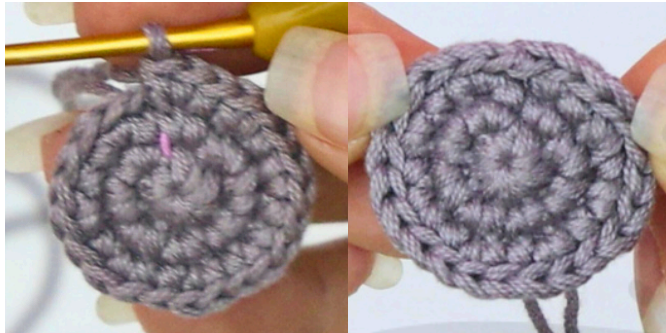
BUCKLE FOR COPPER

Use grey yarn, with a 2.50mm hook.

R1: MR 8sc

Make invisible closure.

CHEST BELT

Use 1mm thick black yarn with a 1.5mm hook

Start with 1 slip knot

R1: 3ch, in the 2nd start 2sc (2)

R2-36: 1ch, turn, 2sc (2)

1ch to secure and cut the thread, it doesn't need to be long just enough to hide it.

BELT

Use 1mm thick black yarn with a 1.5mm hook

Start with 1 slip knot

R1: 4ch, in the 2nd start 3sc (3)

R2-72: 1ch, turn, 3sc (5)

Secure with a chain and cut the yarn, leaving a long end to sew this piece to the other end and attach it to the body. Try the piece on your amigurumi to make sure it goes around the legs correctly. If necessary, add or remove rounds until you reach the ideal length.

BELT BUCKLE (1)

Use grey yarn with a 2.50mm hook

COINS (AS MANY AS YOU WISH)

Use gold-colored yarn with a 2.50mm hook

Repeat the following pattern exactly.

R1: MR 8sc

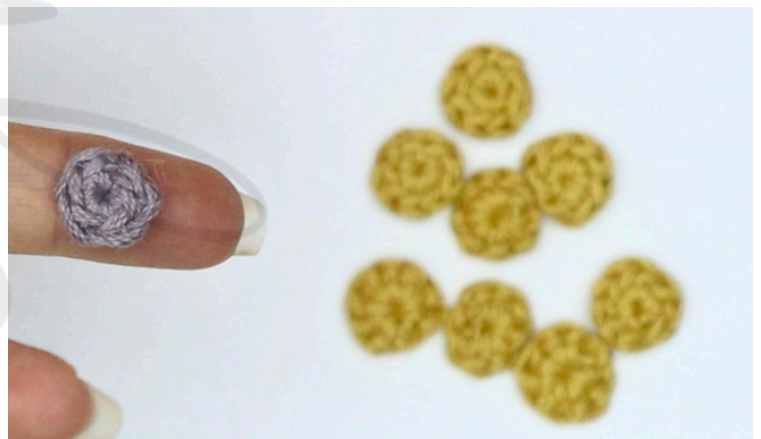
R2: 8inc (16)

R3: (1sc, 1inc)x8 (24)

R4: 24ss

Upon completion, perform an invisible closure.

### INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE CHEST BELT

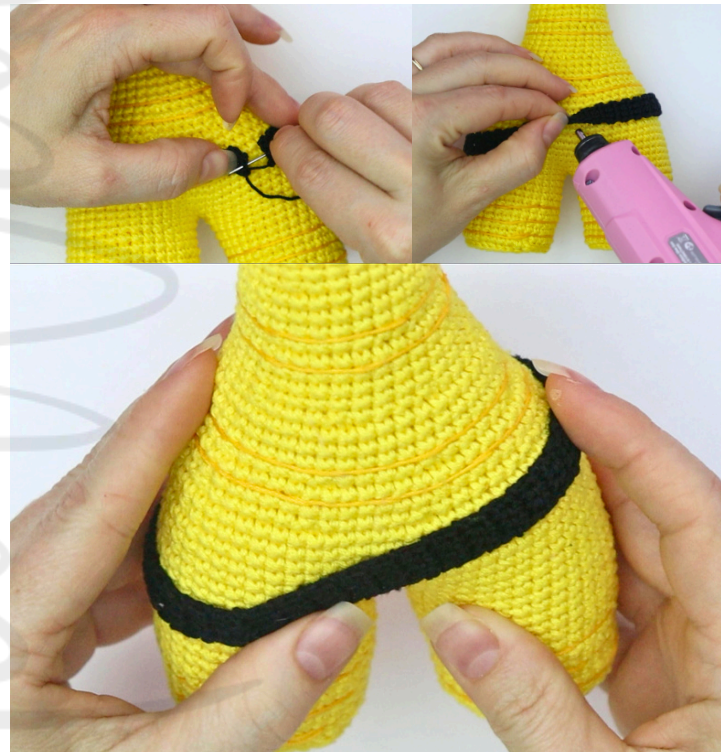
1. Place the black tape around the chest, leaving one end hanging over the lid.
2. At this end, attach the gray circle to form the buckle.
3. Add Velcro to the ends of the tape so you can close it completely.

### SECURING THE BELT TO THE BODY

1. Using a yarn needle, join the two ends of the belt with a seam.
2. Once closed, attach the belt to the body using fabric glue or hot glue to secure it in place.

Next, attach the large gray circle using only glue.

Sew the arms to the sides of the body, placing them between R40 and R41.

### FIXING THE HEAD PARTS

- Attach the four pieces to the head. Three of them should be as upright as possible.
- The remaining piece will be in a hanging position. Before attaching it, sew it closed from one side to the other.

### CHEST TO BELT CONNECTION

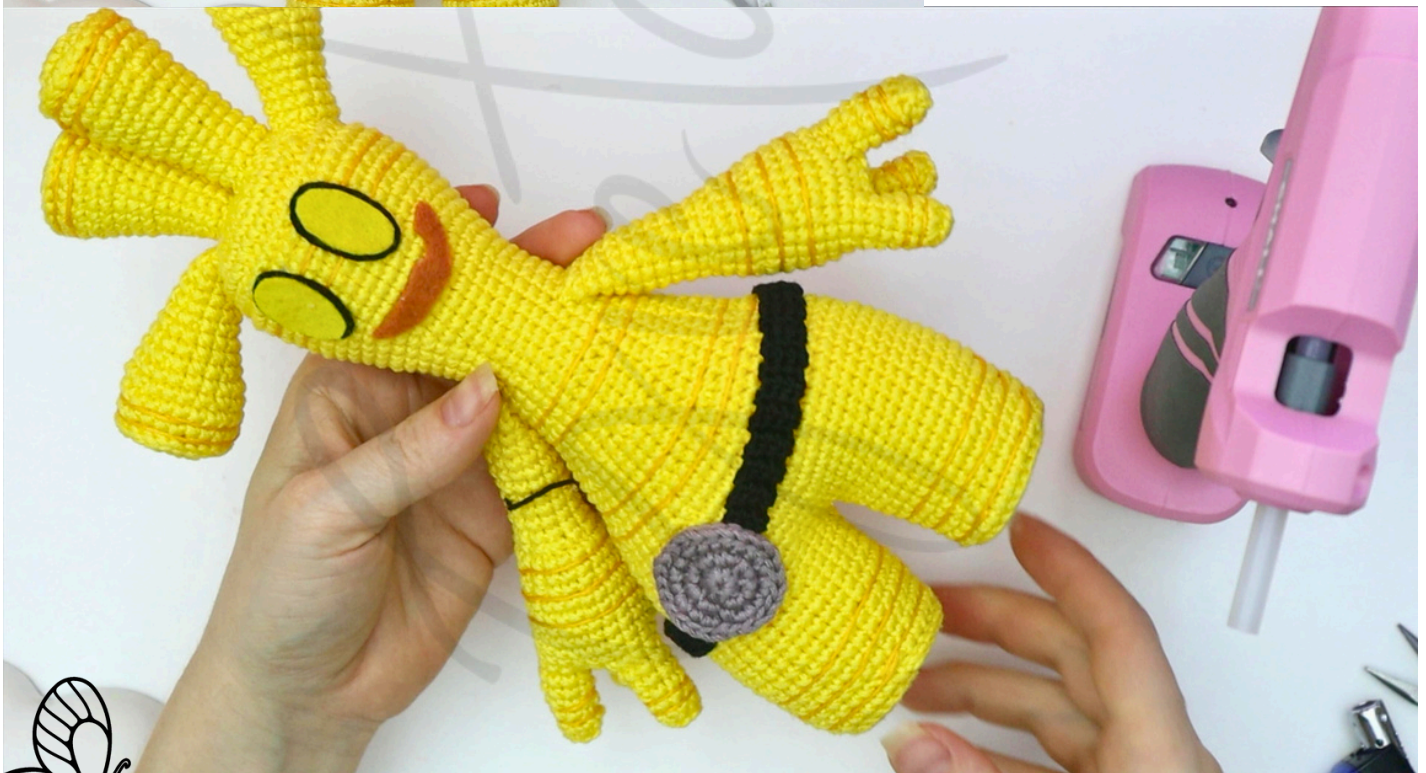
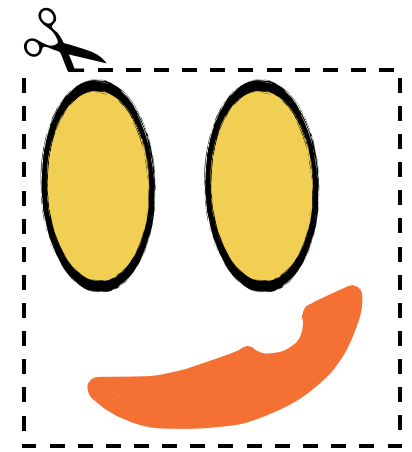
- Secure the chest to the belt at the back,
- as shown in the image.
- First, apply glue only
- in the black area of the belt to attach to the chest.
- Then, for added security, reinforce the connection by sewing the chest piece to the belt with a black thread.



## Assembly Notes

## Eyes and Mouth:

- Positioning: Cut out the pattern rectangle that includes the eyes and mouth. Use it as a guide to position the pieces on the face before attaching them.
- Pieces: Cut the following felt pieces separately: two yellow ovals. Then, glue them onto black felt and trim the black felt, leaving a very thin border.
- Once the eyes are ready, place all the pieces on the face and attach them with fabric glue or hot glue. If you prefer, you can sew them to the fabric for added security.
