Important Note:

This amigurumi is worked with tight stitches and mostly in a spiral pattern, do not close each round unless prompted, you will have to be careful and always mark the start of each lap. Please read the entire pattern before starting.

In the description before buying this pattern, I told you that we have a tutorial on our channel to make this amigurumi.

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Luna measure approximately 9 inches.

Materials:

- 100% Mercerized Cotton yarn, measures approximately 3mm thick and has 6 strands. Colors: Sand 861, Brick 805, White 801, Cinnamon 842, Garnet 823
- 2.5mm hook
- Gold colored thread 1mm thick and 1.25mm hook
- Yarn Needle
- temporary bookmark
- Scissors
- stuffing for amigurumis
- pins
- Silicone
- Wire to articulate amigurumis
- Blush
- 10mm Safety Eyes
- Button to close the dress

Abreviaturas:

- R: Round
- ch: chain
- MR: Magic Ring
- sc: single crochet
- dec: decrease (close 2 sc together)
- inc: Increase (2 sc in 1 stitch)
- triple inc: Increase (3 sc in 1 stitch)
- dc: double crochet
- hdc: half double crochet
- ss: slip stitch
- FLO: Front Loop Only
- BLO: Back Loops Only

Note: You can use this same pattern to make this amigurumi larger or smaller using a thread of greater or lesser thickness and depending on this thread will be the hook number, in the same way you will choose the desired size of the safety eyes

I hope you enjoy this pattern as much as I did designing it for you.





Arms (x2)

Use Sand color yarn or the color you prefer for the skin.

R1: MR 6sc

R2: (2sc, 1inc)x2 (8)

R3: (3sc, 1inc)x2 (10)

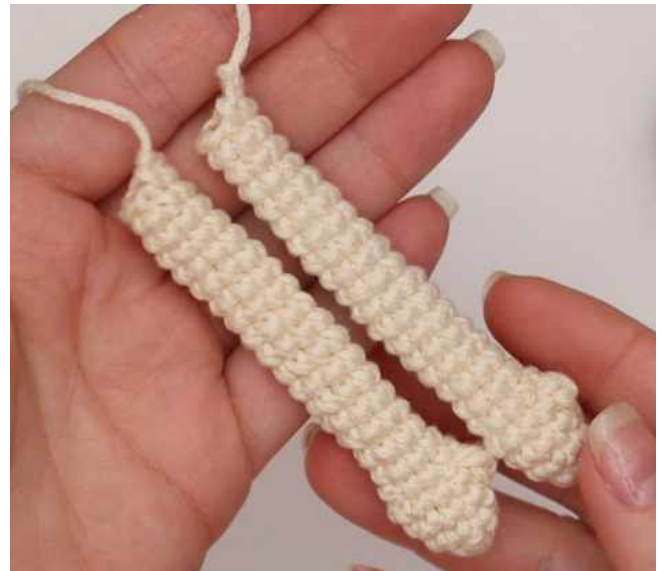
R4: 4 sc, 1 bobble stitch (3sc closed together in the same place), 5 sc (10)

R5: (3sc, 1dec)x2 (8)

R6-22: 8sc



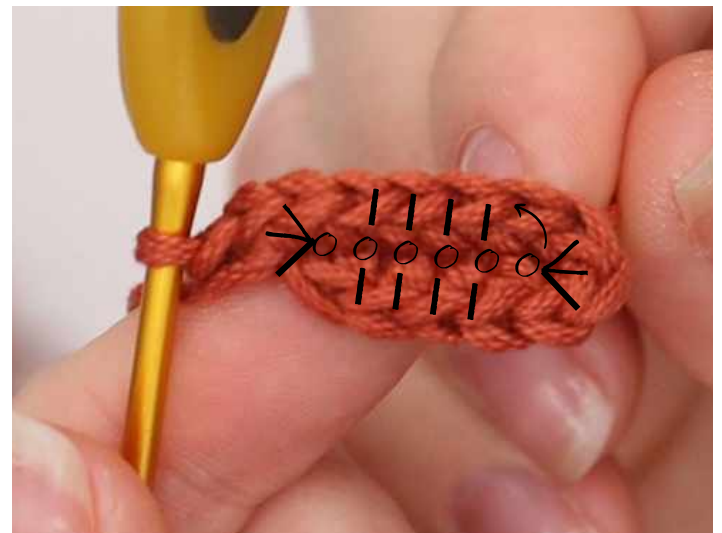
Note: You don't need to leave the long yarn when finishing the arms, remember we won't make seams, they will be attached to the body later.

Legs (x2)

For each leg we will begin by making the Shoe with brick-colored thread.

R1: 6ch, in the 2nd start (4sc, 1 triple inc)x2 (14)

R2: 1inc, 2sc, 5inc, 2sc, 4inc (24)

R3: BLO 24sc

R4-7: 24sc

Note: When the R7 is finished, fill the base with melted Silicone, please enter the link that I share with you if you do not know our technique.

R8: 3sc, 6dec, 4sc, 2dec, 1sc (16)

R9: FLO (1ch, 1ss in the next stitch)x16

Note: The last slipped stitch will be at the base of the 1st stitch that I make in this Round, cut the thread and leave to introduce it inwards and secure it.

Start the sock with white thread

Note: we will be working the next round in the loop that we have left free, starting in the 1st of the previous Round

R10: BLO 1ch, 16sc

R11-12: 16sc

R13: FLO (1ch, 1ss in next stitch)x16

Note: This Round is equal to R9. The last slipped stitch will be at the base of the 1st stitch that I make in this Round, cut the thread and leave to introduce it inwards and secure it.

Start the leg with sand-colored thread or the color you have chosen for the skin, it must be the same with which you made the arms.

Note: we will be working the next round in the loops that we have left free, starting in the 1st of the previous Round





R14: BLO 1ch,16sc

R15: (2sc, 1dec)x4 (12)

R16-24: 12sc Change to White color

Note:

Change to white yarn in the last single crochet of R24.



R25-26: 12sc

Note: When you finish the R26 of the 1st leg that you make, you can cut the thread without leaving it long, however, do not cut the thread of the second leg that you make because we will continue with the union of both legs.



Note: In this link that I share you can see how to locate which will be the central side of each leg. I share the exact stitches that I have left for this union, but no one knits exactly the same, maybe you should adjust this round a bit so that your legs are straight.

Union

R27: 5sc, 3ch, 12sc in the other leg, 3sc in the 3ch, 7sc in the leg we started (30)





R28: (4sc, 1inc)x6 (36)

R29-31: 36sc

R32: (4sc, 1dec)x6 (30)

R33: 30sc Change to Sand color yarn

Note:

Change to Sand colored yarn in the last single crochet of R33.



R34: 30sc

R35: (3sc, 1dec)x6 (24)

R36-37: 24sc

R38: (2sc, 1dec)x6 (18)

R39-41: 18sc

Union of arms

Note: In this link that I share you can see how to locate which will be the central side of each arm. I share the exact stitches that I have left for this union, but no one knits exactly the same, maybe you should adjust this round a bit so that the arms are in the correct shape at the sides of the body.

R42: 1sc, 8sc in 1 arm, 9sc, 8sc in the other, 8sc (34)

R43: 3sc, 1dec, 16sc, 1dec, 11sc, (32)

Note: In R43 you need to make 1 decrease on each side, over each arm, I show you the stitches that I have left but it may be a little different for you.

Note: As you go, place filling according to your comfort. It is not necessary to place filling in the arms.



R44: (2sc, 1dec)x8 (24)

R45: (1sc, 1dec)x8 (16)

R46: (2sc, 1dec)x4 (12)

R47-49: 12sc



continue with your head

R50: 12inc (24)

R51: (1sc, 1inc)x12 (36)

R52: 36sc

R53: (2sc, 1inc)x12 (48)

R54-61: 48sc

R62: (2sc, 1dec)x12 (36)

R63-66: 36sc

Note: When the R66 is finished we will place the Safety eyes and the wire for support and articulation of the neck.





You will use 10mm safety eyes, place them between R58 and 59 with 10 points of separation, as centered as possible towards the front of your amigurumi.

Note: If you decide to use smaller safety eyes, keep in mind that you must decide where to place them.

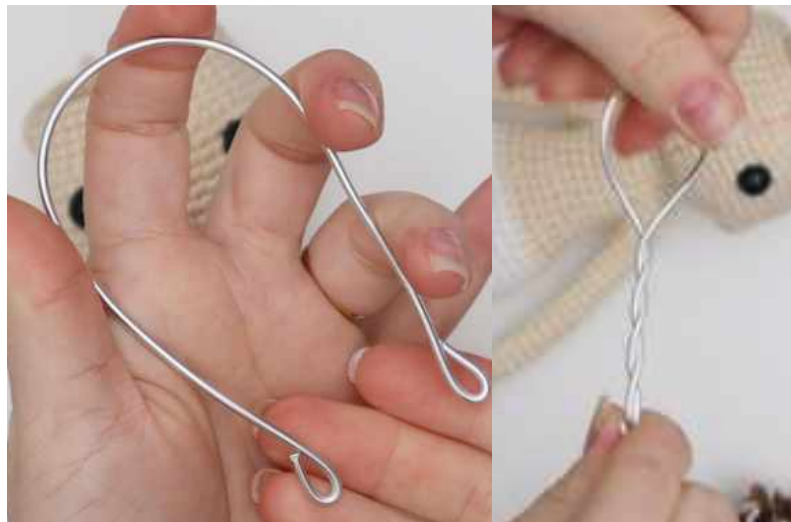

Note: You can use a silicone tube if you want to support the neck without articulation, but Luna is made with wire.

Cut a piece of wire of approximately 20cm and bend it as shown in the following images

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Before inserting the wire into the body, I suggest creating a hole with the help of some pointed instrument. After you place the wire be sure to fill in the neck around it.

R67: (1sc, 1dec)x12 (24)

Fill as much as you can always keeping the wire in the center.



R68: (1sc, 1dec)x8 (16)

R69: 8dec (8)

When you finish R69 you can cut the yarn leaving it long to close using a wool needle.

Note: There is still a hole left, you can place more filling if you think it is necessary

Tip: You can do this closure after you finish the hair to make sure you have filled in enough
