## Important Note:

This amigurumi is worked with tight x-shaped and spiral stitches. Do not close off each row unless indicated; make sure to always mark the beginning of each row. Please read the entire pattern before starting. We have a tutorial on our channel to make this amigurumi. You can access the links attached to each image if you have any questions. If you find any errors in this pattern, please contact me.





With this pattern you can create the three essential Wise Men of the Nativity scene that you see in the image: Melchior, Gaspar and Balthazar. Each one has been designed with a level of detail that will make your Nativity scene stand out for its beauty and delicacy.

Here are the approximate measurements for each King, but it is important to remember that these dimensions can vary depending on the material you choose to use, as well as the thickness of the needle and the tension with which you knit:

- **Melchor, Gaspar and Baltasar: 15 cm tall each**

Each character has their own charm and style, and with the right colors and details, you can customize them to your liking!

We provide you with the full range of colours we have used for each of the Three Wise Men, which will allow you to achieve a similar look. However, we invite you to customize the colours according to your style and preferences.

#### **Colors used for Melchor:**

- Nordic blue for the body
- Meat or skin for hands and head
- White for hair
- Gold for the crown and the cape
- Burdeos red for the crown and cape

#### **Colors used for Gaspar:**

- Leaf green for the body
- Meat or skin for hands and head
- Hair brick
- Gold for the crown and the cape
- Intense olive for the cape

#### **Colors used for Baltazar:**

- Burdeos red for the body
- Wheat for hands and head
- Black for hair
- Rosewood for the turban and cape
- Gold for the details on the turban and cape



**Yarn used:**

- For this project I used Sinfonía yarn, made of 100% mercerized cotton. This yarn has an approximate thickness of 3 mm and is made up of 6 strands, which gives it a soft and high-quality finish.

**Materials:**

- 2.5mm hook
- Black sewing thread for embroidering the eyes
- Silicone glue stick
- Wire to articulate the amigurumi
- Go to work
- Scissors
- Time marker
- Pins
- Stuffing for amigurumis
- Blush for your cheeks is optional.

**Abbreviations:**

- R: Round
- ch: chain stitch
- MR: Magic ring
- sc: single crochet
- dec: decrease (close 2 sc together)
- inc: Increase (2sc in 1 stitch)
- dc: doble crochet
- hdc: half double crochet
- ss: Slip stitch
- FLO: Front Loop Only (take only the front strand)
- BLO: Back Loop Only (take only the back strand)

We will make 3 base bodies using the same pattern, but with different colors for each one. Below, we share with you which King each body is for and the specific colors we will use for each one:

Base bodies for the characters:

- Melchor: Nordic blue and flesh or skin
- Gaspar: Leaf green and flesh or skin
- Baltazar: Burdeos red and wheat-colored thread

The demonstration will be done using Baltazar's colors.

## Brazos (x2)

Start using the appropriate color for the skin

R1: MR 8sc

R2-5: 8sc In the last sc of R5 Change to the appropriate color yarn for each body

R6: FLO 8inc (16)

R7: 16sc

R8: 16sc back post

R9-11: 16sc

At the end of R11, it is necessary to place the hand inside the sleeve to ensure that it is well positioned.



R12: (2sc, 1dec)x4 (12)

R13-16: 12sc

R17: (1sc, 1dec)x4 (8)

Make a perfect seam at the end of each arm. This will make it easier to join the body later and ensure a clean, neat finish.



## Body

Begin the body using the appropriate yarn color for each body

R1: MR 8sc

R2: 8inc (16)

R3: (1sc, 1inc)x8 (24)

R4: (2sc, 1inc)x8 (32)

R5: 1sc, 1inc, (3sc, 1inc)x7, 2sc (40)

R6: 40sc back post

R7-8: 40 sc

After finishing R8, place the base on a flat surface and apply hot silicone glue. Make sure to heat up your glue gun very well, as the heat will allow the base to set on its own. When the silicone cools, the base will become firm, allowing your amigurumi to stand very well on its own.

If you prefer, you can also place a button that is the same size as the base, or cut a piece of plastic that works well as reinforcement. I do not recommend using cardboard, as it could deform over time and affect the stability of your amigurumi.

R9: (3sc, 1dec)x8 (32)  
 R10-14: 32sc  
 R15: (6sc, 1dec)x4 (28)  
 R16-20: 28sc  
 R21: (5sc, 1dec)x4 (24)  
 R22-24: 24sc  
 R25: 4sc 4sc joining one arm, 8sc, 4sc  
 joining another arm, 4sc (24)

For this arm join, you will take the stitch from the inside out, and in turn, a stitch on the body. Unlike the next round, where you will work in each stitch that you left free on each arm.

R26: 4sc 4sc joining in one arm, 8sc, 4sc in other arm, 4sc (24)

R27: 24 sc

After R27, put stuffing on the body before continuing to close. Be careful not to put too much stuffing so that the base remains flat and the amigurumi is stable.

R28: 12dec (12) Change to the same color of yarn that I used on the hands

R29-30: 12sc

After finishing R30, wire each arm. This is optional; you can leave the arms unwired if you prefer. However, by wire-wiring, the excess will be left on the head, which will allow Mary to be positioned very tenderly, especially by having her look towards baby Jesus.

R31: FLO 12inc (24)

R32: (1sc, 1inc)x12 (36)

After R32, I suggest you add a little more stuffing to the body, especially around the wire in the neck area, to ensure a firm and stable shape.

R33-43 :36sc

R44: (4sc, 1dec)x6 (30)

R45: (3sc, 1dec)x6 (24)

Stuff the head after finishing R45, always trying to keep the wire as centered as possible. Keep in mind that when you finish the last round of the head, you can add more stuffing if you consider it necessary to give it the right shape.

R46: (2sc, 1dec)x6 (18)

R47: (1sc, 1dec)x6 (12)

R48: 12sc

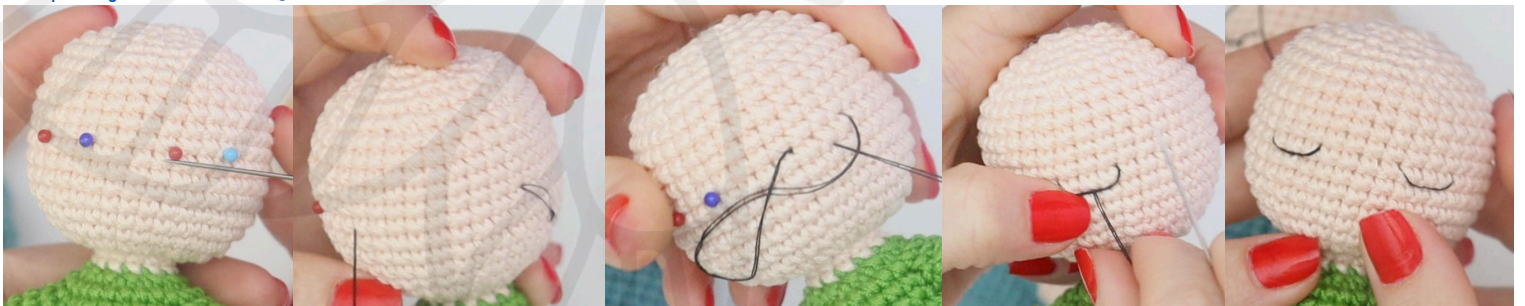
When you finish R12, cut the thread leaving enough length to completely close the head using a wool needle.

You have now completed a body. Remember to repeat this process two more times, using the correct colors for each character or the ones you have chosen.

Let's start with the embroidery of the eyes for the Three Wise Men, since the design is the same for all three. Place pins between R38 and R39, leaving approximately 4 stitches between the eyes. Each eye will take up 3 stitches, and the embroidery will be done just above R38.

Use black color yarn

R1: MR 6sc

R2: 6inc (12)

R3: (1sc, 1inc)x6 (18)

R4: (2sc, 1inc)x6 (24)

R5: 1sc, 1inc, (3sc, 1inc)x5, 2sc (30)

R6: (4sc, 1inc)x6 (36)

R7-13: 36sc

R14: 1ss, (6ch, in the 2nd st start BLO 5hdc, skip 1st, 1ss)x18

I'm showing you pictures of Baltazar's hair in a different color just so you can better appreciate the stitches, since with black thread it can be harder to see the details. This will help you follow the pattern more clearly.

When you finish the last slip stitch of this hair, secure it and hide it.

## Balthazar's beard

Use strong cinnamon colored thread

Start with a slip knot

9ch, in the 2nd start, 2sc, 14hdc, 2sc, 7ss,

4ch, skip 4sts, 7ss, 1ch to secure and leave long tail to sew

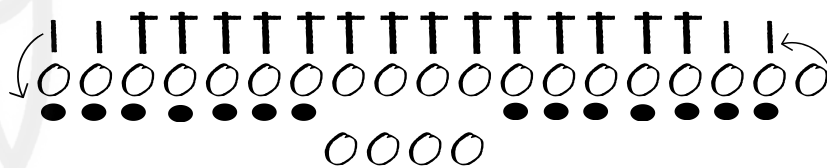

Melchior and Gaspar's hair are exactly the same pattern. However, for Melchior you will use white thread, and for Gaspar you will use brick-colored thread.

Use the appropriate color yarn for each wise king

- R1: MR 6sc
- R2: 6inc (12)
- R3: (1sc, 1inc)x6 (18)
- R4: (2sc, 1inc)x6 (24)
- R5: 1sc, 1inc, (3sc, 1inc)x5, 2sc (30)
- R6: (4sc, 1inc)x6 (36)
- R7-13: 36sc
- R14: 1ss, (8ch, in the 2nd st start BLO 7hdc, skip 2st, 1ss)x12

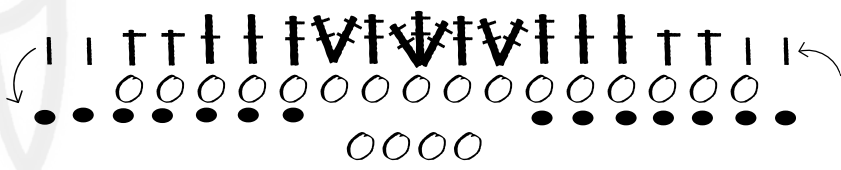
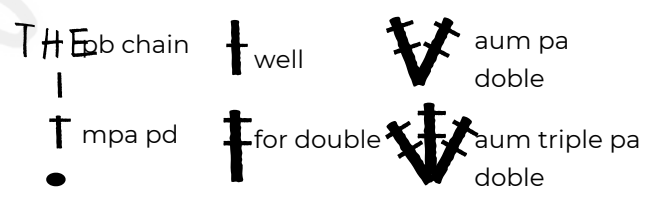
The same goes for Melchior and Gaspar's beards, which follow exactly the same pattern. As with the hair, for Melchior you will use white thread, and for Gaspar, brick-colored thread.

Start with a slip knot  
20ch, in the 2nd start, 2sc, 2hdc, 2dc, 1dc double, 1inc dc double, 1dc double, 1inc triple dc double, 1dc double, 1inc dc double, 1dc double, 2dc, 2hdc, 2sc, 7pd, 5c, skip 5sts 7pd, 1chain to secure

When you finish the last slip stitch of this hair, secure it and hide it. Keep in mind that, for Jose, we are going to flip this hair to achieve the proper finish.





The capes of the Three Wise Men follow exactly the same pattern. However, the colors vary for each one:

- Melchor: Burgundy red and gold
- Gaspar: Rosewood and gold
- Baltazar: Intense olive and gold

Starting each layer with the appropriate color for each wise man Start with 1 slipknot

R1: 19ch, in the 2nd start BLO 14hdc, 4sc (18)

R2: 1ch, turn, 4sc, 14hdc (18)

For the following rounds repeat the following 7 more times:

R3: 1ch, turn, BLO 14hdc, 4sc(18)

R4: 1ch, turn, BLO 4sc, 14hdc (18)

In the last hdc of R16 change to gold thread, slip stitch around the edge until you reach the top corner, 13ch in the 2nd st, start BLO 12ss, more ss on the edge, in the other corner again 13ch in the 2nd st, start BLO 12ss, complete the remaining edge with ss.

R1: MR 6sc

R2: 6inc (12)

R3: (1sc, 1inc)x6 (18)

R4: (2sc, 1inc)x6 (24)

R5: 1sc, 1inc, (3sc, 1inc)x5, 2sc (30)

R6: (4sc, 1inc)x6 (36)

R7-9: 36sc change to gold thread

R10: 36sc

R11: BLO 36sc Make a perfect closure using a wool needle.

## Crown of Gaspar

Use gold thread Start with 1 slip knot

R1: 36ch, 36sc starting at the 1st ch from the beginning forming a ring

R2-3: 36sc

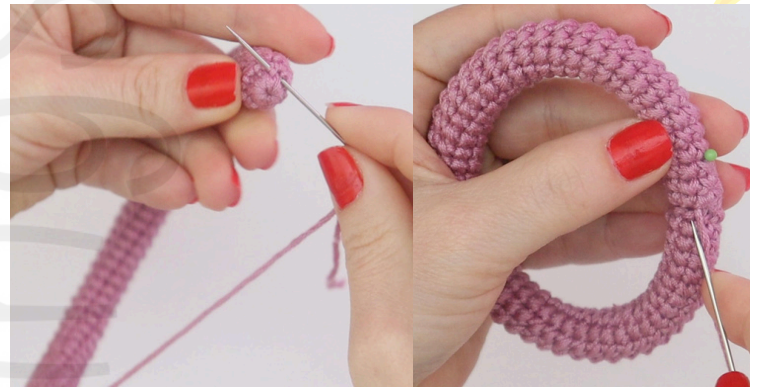
R4: 1ss, [skip 2 sts, (1 fan: 3dc, 3ch, 1ss, 3dc), skip 2 sts, 1ss)x6

## Turban for Balthazar

Use rose-colored yarn

R1: MR 8sc

R2-56: 8sc

It is important to fill the piece as you go, since leaving all the filling for the end can be more complicated. When you have finished all the rounds, join the piece with a seam using a tapestry needle to ensure a good finish.

## Detail

With Gold thread

R1: 5ch, in the 2nd start 4sc

R2-12: turn, 4sc

Finish the piece by making a chain to secure, cut and hide the strands, then join it to the ring formed previously in the closure area, using glue to secure the joint.

We will begin by joining each piece together to form each Wise Man. We will use silicone glue to join all the parts together, but if you prefer, you can sew the pieces together. Don't forget to check out our video if you have any questions during the process. Also, it is necessary to stretch the fabric of each hair to obtain the desired finish before joining it together. Please note that I have not attached the crowns to the heads and the capes will only be secured with a simple knot in the front.

Let's make the gifts: two boxes and a vase.  
 You can choose the colours you prefer, but I made a box in burgundy red and gold, another in rosewood and gold, and the vase in strong cinnamon and gold.

For each box, you will make two different but very similar pieces. Then, you will mount one piece on top of the other. With a strand of gold thread, you will add the decorative detail. It is important that you watch the video for a better understanding of the process.

When finished, make a chain to secure, then cut the thread. It is not necessary to leave the thread long.

R6: 12sc

R9: FLO 8inc(16)

R10: 16sc

R11: 16ss

When you finish the last round, make a perfect closure using a wool needle. Also, add a little stuffing so that it doesn't lose its shape. Then, add the detail with gold thread, much easier than with the little boxes.
